He has taught at numerous universities including Oxford, Hebrew University of
Jerusalem, Brandeis University, University of Glasgow, and Tel Aviv University.
His numerous writings include: *The Jews in Modern France* (1985), *The*Secret Lives of Trebitsch Lincoln, Herbert Samuel: A Political Life (1992),
Vanishing Diaspora: The Jews in Europe since 1945 (1996), Secret War in
Shanghai (1999), Divided Jerusalem: The Struggle for the Holy City (2001),

Israelis and Palestinians: Why Do They Fight? Can They Stop? (Yale U.P., 2003), Barbarism and Civilization: A History of Europe in Our Time (Oxford U.P., 2007), and On the Eve: the Jews of Europe before the Second World War.:

His current research and writing are mainly dedicated to three projects: first, a study of European Jewish intellectuals in the period after 1945; second, a biography of Gertrude van Tijn (1891-1974); and third, a micro-historical study of the relations of Jews with their neighbours in a small Polish town, Krakowiec, over the period of 1772 to 1946.
