Medea Benjamin is a cofounder of both CODEPINK and the international human rights organization Global Exchange. Described as "one of America's most committed -- and most effective -- fighters for human rights" by New York Newsday, and "one of the high profile leaders of the peace movement" by the Los Angeles Times, she was one of 1,000 exemplary women from 140 countries nominated to receive the Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of the millions of women who do the essential work of peace worldwide. In 2010 she received the Martin Luther King, Jr. Peace Prize from the Fellowship of Reconciliation and the 2012 Peace Prize by the US Peace Memorial. Benjamin is the author of eight books. Her latest book is *Drone Warfare: Killing by Remote Control*, and she has been campaigning to stop the use of killer drones (codepink.org, 2014).
