## **Club Scrubs**

Club Scrubs is a hands on, exciting, interactive club for high school students interested in exploring health careers.

Club Scrubs meets twice monthly from 5:30 - 7:00 pm on Tuesdays.

## **High School Exploration Day**

This event takes place once a semester on the OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center Campus, usually in the fall. Open to high school juniors, seniors and their legal guardians who are considering a career in a healthcare profession.

Participants will interact with current students, providing the opportunity to learn about different healthcare career options with the OU colleges of Nursing, Medicine, Physician Assistant, Allied Health and Pharmacy.





### **MASH Camp**

MASH Camp (Math and Science in Health Careers) is a week-long camp during the summer for students currently in 9th - 12th grades.

Students participate in learning about health careers through a series of stimulating, hands-on learning activities in mathematics, science, and multidisciplinary studies.

## MASH Camp Reunion

High school students who successfully complete the MASH Camp are invited to a reunion where the students are involved in health care related activities, breakout sessions, and are able to ask questions, seek advice and listen to personal testimonies from current health care professionals.

MASH Camp Reunion takes place over the winter holiday break.

#### Mini Med School

#### Penpals (4-5th)

This program connects 4th and 5th grade students with a medical student through letter writing and interactive activities.

#### Forerunners (6-8th)

Forerunners is an interactive club for 6-8th grade students interested in science and health careers.

Students will interact with medical students twice a month and participate in projects/experiments that introduce them to the world of STEM and healthcare in their daily lives.

Junior Varsity (9th and 10th) & Varsity (11th and 12th)
Every other month within the Club Scrubs program
students will be split by grade into Mini Med School's
Junior Varsity (JV) and Varsity Programs for professional
development workshops one week and capstone
projects the second week. OU-TU SCM medical students
will serve as mentors and capstone project leaders.

#### **Family Night**

Family Night is an opportunity for the Mini Med School programs to be shared with interested students and their families led by medical students, faculty and staff.
