Criteria for Determining Membership on the Graduate Faculty School of Drama

Revised September 1993

- 1. To be appointed a member of the school of Drama's Graduate Faculty in a theatre a faculty member must have [a] three years' F.T.E. teaching experience in higher education at the level of Instructor or above; [b] a terminal degree, either Ph.D. or M.F.A. OR evidence of at least five years' successful experience in the non-profit or commercial professional theatre; and [c] evidence of substantial on-going creative activity, creative development or publication on the regional or national level.
- 2. To retain member status on the Graduate Faculty in Drama, the faculty member must show evidence of substantial on-going creative activity, creative development, professional service or publication on the regional or national level. Graduate faculty membership is subject to renewal after a 7-year term.
- 3. Any member of the Graduate Faculty may teach graduate courses and serve on M.A. and M.F.A thesis committee; however, to chair a thesis committee, the member must have served previously as a member on no fewer than three thesis committees.
- 4. Full-time, part-time, resident or visiting faculty member who do not meet the criteria above but are particularly qualified for a specific thesis project or to teach specific graduate courses may be recommended for Special Membership for a limited amount of time.
- 5. Adjunct Faculty and artists-in-residence may be recommended for appointment as Special Members or Members-at-large in specific cases.
