#### UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university — as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations — places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma State Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

#### NORMAN CAMPUS

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Joe C. and Carole Kerr McClendon Honors College, the College of International Studies, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Liberal Studies. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state and around the world.

The Norman campus consists of four sections -- central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and awardwinning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family -- Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

#### South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the Law Center and OU Foundation; the University apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hines Fields – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; and OUr Children's World Learning Center.

#### **Research Campus**

OU's new 271-acre University Research Campus brings together academic, public, and private sector organizations in a mutually beneficial collaborative environment. It is anchored by the Stephenson Research and Technology Center, where cutting-edge research into life science fields ranging from robotics to genomic studies is taking place, and by the National Weather Center, a 244,000-square-foot facility that opened in August 2006 and that houses University educational and research facilities as well as federal operational forecasting, research and training facilities involving more than 550 people.

A series of "Partners Place" buildings house private sector and University organizations encompassing areas ranging from weather and hydrology to applied social research and geospatial information technologies. New to the Research Campus is a \$2.5 million commercial weather radar, OU-PRIME, to support research and education. Recently opened is Four Partners Place, a new facility which includes the OU Supercomputing Center and the Center for Research Program Development and Enrichment.

Combined, more than 650,000 square feet now comprise the Research Campus. In the planning phase are light industrial facilities and Five Partners Place. OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which allows the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to find in a timely fashion quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria.

#### North Campus

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a State Agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

#### HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use the clinical, laboratory and teaching facilities at the OU Medical Center, Veterans Administration Medical Center, The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center, Presbyterian Hospital, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute, Oklahoma Department of Health, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, other affiliated hospitals in Oklahoma City, the major teaching hospitals in Tulsa, the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee and various affiliated hospitals and clinics in other locations in Oklahoma. The OU Health Sciences Center is composed of the Presbyterian Health Foundation Research Park and 30 other biomedical entities, including the OU Health Sciences Center as its centerpiece.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

The Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center represents the largest public-private biomedical initiative in Oklahoma history. The 210,000-square-foot facility provides patient-centered care by the largest and most experienced group of cancer specialists, offering the most advanced cancer detection and treatment technology. OU's Harold Hamm Diabetes Center is one of the top comprehensive diabetes centers in the world for adults and children with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, engaging in novel research aimed at progress toward a cure for diabetes and its complications.

#### OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize the strong campus-community partnerships and that leverage the unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa City-County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the OU College of Medicine enrolls 60 medical students in their third and fourth years and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of Medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine.

#### COLLEGE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The College of Continuing Education provides academic outreach opportunities to the state, region and nation. As the administrative unit for outreach at the University of Oklahoma, continuing education programs are the means by which the university extends its resources to the people of Oklahoma and beyond. By encompassing comprehensive, multidisciplinary academic services and programs that focus on the needs of adult learners, the College of Continuing Education offers both credit and non-credit courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, correspondence study, public service activities, and travel/study programs. The diversity and quality of the services available through continuing education programs provide an exciting and challenging academic experience.

OU achieved a new record-high number of degrees conferred - 7,495 - according to data for OU students who graduated in 2011-12.

For the first time in OU history, OU students won the Rhodes, Marshall and Mitchell scholarships in the same year.

Two OU students were named 2012 Goldwater Scholars, bringing to 33 the number of OU students named Goldwater Scholars since 1995 and placing OU in the top ranks of universities nationally. One Honors junior was selected as a recipient of the Truman Scholarship and another Honors student was named a Udall Scholar.

OU journalism professor and foreign correspondent Mike Boettcher was awarded two Emmys for his coverage of the war in Afghanistan, marking the first time an active university professor also serving as a war correspondent has won an Emmy. In addition, Boettcher's son, Carlos, produced the story, making it the first time a father and son had won Emmys for the same story.

An OU assistant professor and colleagues announced that they had identified two white dwarf stars considered the oldest and closest known to man. Astronomers identified these 11- to 12-billion-year-old white dwarf stars only 100 light years away from Earth. These stars are the closest known examples of the oldest stars in the Universe forming soon after the Big Bang, according to the researcher.

OU launched an exciting digital initiative embracing digital technologies to create an even more dynamic classroom experience for its students. The One University digital initiative utilizes iTunes U to promote dynamic learning experiences, enhance services to students, tap the creativity of OU research, build OU's national and international brand as an innovative university, and implement investments in OU's information technology infrastructure to enable the widespread use of technology in the future.

OU was named the 2012 Big 12 Conference Champion for using more green power than any other school in the Big 12 Conference, according to standings released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. OU later was recognized as one of only four organizations nationwide to be selected as a Green Power Partner of the Year by the EPA.

Norman campus faculty achieved a record number of research awards in FY 2012, topping \$93 million for the first time in the university's history. The faculty also submitted a record 803 proposals to external funding sources, requesting more than \$300 million.

The Oxley Foundation presented OU with a \$30 million gift for the proposed Tulsa School of Community Medicine; the joint four-year community medical education program is being created to help address Oklahoma's low health status, low health systems performance and physician shortage.

The School of Community Medicine also received a \$6 million grant from the A.R. and Marylouise Tandy Foundation to establish a medical simulation center, utilizing the latest advances in medical simulation training and education to train students.

Researchers at the Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center were awarded a \$10 million grant from the National Institutes of Health to look for answers to a critical problem in cancer therapy - why some cancer cells become resistant to chemo and radiation therapy, and what can be done to overcome that resistance. The Center of Biomedical Research Excellence grant augmented and strengthened research at the Stephenson Cancer Center by establishing a mentoring program for promising new cancer researchers and enhancing the research infrastructure at the cancer center.

OU received a \$1.5 million gift as the first distribution of what was expected to total \$3.7 million from the estate of the late OU alumnus Crockett H. Page, M.D., to establish an endowed scholarship fund in the College of Medicine. The gift boosted the college's \$10 million Second Century Campaign for Scholarships to more than \$7.1 million.

The National Institutes of Health awarded the Harold Hamm Diabetes Center a \$10.8 million grant to enable the center's researchers to examine the causes and complications of diabetes, leading to new methods of treatment and, in some cases, prevent complications of the disease altogether.

With a goal of stimulating innovative scientific research to find a cure for diabetes, the Harold Hamm Diabetes Center announced the establishment of the Harold Hamm International Prize for Biomedical Research in Diabetes. The center announced that it would award and administer the \$250,000 prize, one of the largest of its kind in the world, to recognize and promote lasting achievements in diabetes research.

The College of Liberal Studies was awarded a \$1 million endowment gift and a \$50,000 bridge grant from The Bernard Osher Foundation in San Francisco to continue the Osher Reentry Student Scholarship program permanently, something the college has been working toward since receiving the first grant in 2008. The Osher Reentry Scholarships are designed to help reentry students (ideally aged 25 to 50) complete their first undergraduate degree.

The first Peggy Dow Helmerich Scholarships were awarded to 46 students in the Peggy Dow Helmerich School of Drama.

A major gift from Jan Marie Crawford of Denver, a former director of Union Activities at Oklahoma Memorial Union, helped fund the renovation of the union's University Club, which was named in perpetuity as the Jan Marie and Richard J. Crawford Faculty Club.

Mildred Nichols Hamilton, a 1943 journalism alumna and noted journalist who died in 2010, directed nearly \$1 million in her estate to establish a scholarship endowment for women journalism students. She served as *The Oklahoma Daily*'s editor in the fall of 1943 and was the first woman ever to take a seat in the Oklahoma Memorial Stadium press box.

Former OU football All-Americans Adrian Peterson and Sam Bradford made gift commitments of \$1 million and \$500,000, respectively, to the OU Athletics Department. Half of Peterson's gift and Bradford's entire gift were in support of the construction of Headington Hall, OU's new student housing facility that is scheduled to open in fall 2013. The other half of Peterson's gift endowed a football scholarship.

OU received its largest one-time gift in scholarship support for OU students to study abroad, a \$1 million donation from the Lobeck Taylor Family Foundation of Tulsa. The gift, which brought OU's overall Campaign for Scholarships to more than \$211.7 million, was designated for study abroad scholarships for students participating in OU's signature study abroad program in Arezzo, Italy.

OU received a \$600,000 commitment from the Rainbolt family of Oklahoma City to endow scholarships and a Presidential Professorship in the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education.

Inasmuch Foundation of Oklahoma City made a \$500,000 gift for the Scholars Walk, a pedestrian walkway that will honor academic achievement. Scholars Walk will be a gift in memory of Edith Kinney Gaylord, who established Inasmuch Foundation in 1982. It will feature large pavers engraved with the names and class years of OU undergraduate and graduate students who have been honored with the most prestigious national and international academic scholarships since OU's founding in 1890. The project also will add two sculptures, recognizing the most outstanding faculty member of OU's first 50 years and the most outstanding faculty member representing OU's second 50 years.

In September, the Haruv Institute, in collaboration with OU, launched a unique conference on the topic of child abuse and neglect that integrated knowledge and expertise from Israel and the United States, with the participation of world-leading experts in the field. The conference was hosted at OU-Tulsa and sponsored by the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation.

OU officials broke ground on the Radar Innovations Lab - the only facility of its kind in the nation - at a public ceremony. Scheduled for completion in fall 2013, the lab is the eighth research facility to be built on the OU Research Campus in less than a decade.

To foster the continued growth and expansion of biomedical research and related commercial efforts that further health care, OU and the Presbyterian Health Foundation finalized work toward the university's purchase of the PHF Research Park.

1890	On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
1891	First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
1892	David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president of the University of Oklahoma.
	On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.




# Student Affairs Organizational Chart

Norman Campus Provost Organizational Chart




Norman Campus Administration and Finance Organizational Chart



Information Technology Organizational Chart



### Health Sciences Center Senior Vice President and Provost Organizational Chart






#### **Retention and Graduation Rates**










Average Instructional Faculty Salary by Rank






State Appropriations - Law Center

















Distribution of Space by Program Classification Tulsa Campus





Distribution of Space by College and Administrative Unit Oklahoma City Campus








