ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university – as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations – places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma State Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

NORMAN CAMPUS

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Joe C. and Carole Kerr McClendon Honors College, the College of International Studies, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Liberal Studies. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state and around the world.

The Norman campus consists of four sections – central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the College of Law; the OU Foundation; OU Traditions apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hynes Field – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; and OU Children's World Learning Center.

Research Campus

In less than a decade, the 277-acre OU Research Campus has been transformed from an empty field to a thriving economic engine shaped by a community of public and private sector collaborations located in nearly 1 million square feet of occupied space representing \$300 million in investment. Today, the Research Campus brings together 1,700 workers across academic, federal, state and industrial organizations in a mutually beneficial environment.

The National Weather Center, a 257,000 square-foot facility that opened in 2006, anchors the OU Research Campus on the south. The Center houses both academic and federal groups dedicated to forecasting, research and training. The 260,000 square-foot Stephenson Research complex houses cutting-edge research in fields including robotics, genomics, bioengineering and the OU Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, which includes a National Institutes of Health-funded structural biology program. A series of five "Partners Place" buildings, totaling 362,000 square-feet, enable the public and private sector collaboration on weather and radar research; innovation and entrepreneurship; and water, climate, and energy. Additionally, a 35,000 square-foot "one of a kind" Radar Innovations Laboratory is scheduled to open in 2014.

OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which allows the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria. OU's Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks, placing it among such past recipients as Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, Purdue Research Park in Indiana and University City Science Center in Pennsylvania.

North Campus

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a state agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. It is one of only four comprehensive academic health centers in the nation with seven professional colleges. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use the clinical, laboratory and teaching facilities at the OU Medical Center, Veterans Administration Medical Center, The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center, Presbyterian Hospital, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute, Oklahoma Department of Health, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, other affiliated hospitals in Oklahoma City, the major teaching hospitals in Tulsa, the Veterans Administration Hospital in Muskogee and various affiliated hospitals and clinics in other locations in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma Health Center is composed of the former Presbyterian Health Foundation Research Park and 30 other biomedical entities, including the OU Health Sciences Center as its centerpiece.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

The Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center represents the largest public-private biomedical initiative in Oklahoma history. The 210,000-square-foot facility provides patient-centered care by the largest and most experienced group of cancer specialists, offering the most advanced cancer detection and treatment technology. OU's Harold Hamm Diabetes Center is one of the top comprehensive diabetes centers in the world for adults and children with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, engaging in novel research aimed at progress toward a cure for diabetes and its complications.

OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize the strong campus-community partnerships and leverage the unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa City-County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa enrolls 60 medical students in their third and fourth years and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of Medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine. The University of Tulsa and the University of Oklahoma recently signed a memo of understanding to commence the process to seek approval of the accreditation body for U.S. medical schools to expand the School of Community Medicine to a four-year educational track as a partnership of TU and OU.

COLLEGE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The College of Continuing Education provides academic outreach opportunities to the state, region and nation. As the administrative unit for outreach at the University of Oklahoma, continuing education programs are the means by which the university extends its resources to the people of Oklahoma and beyond. By encompassing comprehensive, multidisciplinary academic services and programs that focus on the needs of adult learners, the College of Continuing Education offers both credit and non-credit courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, correspondence study, public service activities, and travel/study programs. The diversity and quality of the services available through continuing education programs provide an exciting and challenging academic experience.

With the goal of increasing the four-year graduation rate and saving students and families thousands of dollars by graduating in four years, the University of Oklahoma implemented flat-rate tuition and mandatory fees for full-time undergraduate students carrying between 12 and 21 credit hours per semester to enable them to graduate sooner. The rate was based on OU's current 15-credit hour rate for tuition and mandatory fees. Under the new plan, students could enroll in up to 21 hours and pay for only 15.

OU averaged the lowest increase in tuition and fees nationwide at a statewide public university over the last five years, according to a recent College Board report. The College Board's Trends in College Pricing 2013 report indicated that OU had the lowest increase in tuition and fees for in-state students – 4 percent – over the five-year period from 2008-09 to 2013-14. The report follows the introduction of OU's new flat-rate tuition and mandatory fees program.

To advance OU's commitment to assist students seeking admission, the university announced it would begin using the Common Application, effective with the academic year beginning fall 2014 for incoming freshmen. The Common App simplifies the process for students applying for admission to more than one university and also enables OU to share its admission process nationwide.

The University of Oklahoma became the first public university in the nation to be awarded the prestigious Davis Cup in recognition of its record-setting enrollment of United World College international freshmen. OU's 45 Davis United World College Scholars also represented the largest class ever enrolled at a Davis UWC Scholars Program partner institution.

OU was listed as "one of the country's strongest public research universities" in a report from the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, which awarded the university reaccreditation with no additional monitoring. In its review of the university's progress, the report noted that OU is "well known and respected, with a rich history," and "is led by a long-term, strong, highly visible president who has developed a broad vision for the university and who has ensured that the institution has 'stayed the course' throughout the years, including through difficult economic times. The result has been dramatic progress in all dimensions of the university's mission."

The OU Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks. The award recognizes the Research Campus for excellence in innovation and places it among such past recipients as the Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, Purdue Research Park in Indiana and University City Science Center in Pennsylvania.

OU received \$194,258,280 in private gifts and gifts-in-kind in the 2013 fiscal year, making it one of the top two fundraising years in OU history. Private giving increased OU's endowment to more than \$1.24 billion. In the OU Foundation's 70-year history, it has received more than \$1 billion in contributions. Eighty percent of all gifts to the OU Foundation have been received during President David Boren's tenure.

Donors continued to provide major support for OU's top priority Campaign for Scholarships, which now stands at \$237 million, including more than \$186 million in endowed funds that will provide perpetual support for scholarships. The College of Medicine's Second Century Scholarship Campaign had raised more than \$8 million by the end of 2013. Before that campaign began in 2010, the total scholarship endowment had been \$10 million. The campaign has enabled OU to more than double its private scholarships in the past five years.

Headington Hall, a six-story, 230,000-square-foot residence hall for 380 students, including 180 student-athletes, opened in August 2013. Reflecting the architecture of OU's most historic and beautiful buildings, the \$75 million privately funded center is named in honor of alumnus and former OU tennis player Tim Headington, one of many alumni who contributed to the project. Other major donors include former OU football stars Sam Bradford and Adrian Peterson.

OU was named the 2013 Big 12 Conference Champion for using more green power than any other school in the conference, according to rankings released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Since April 2006, EPA's Green Power Partnership has tracked and recognized the collegiate athletic conferences with the highest combined green power purchases in the nation. The Individual Conference Champion Award recognizes the school that has made the largest individual purchase of green power within a qualifying conference. OU beat its conference rivals by using nearly 154 million kilowatt-hours of green power, representing 85 percent of the school's annual electricity usage.

A historic signing ceremony was held transferring OU's ownership of the George Nigh Rehabilitation Center to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. This was a significant event involving OU and a tribal entity, as it marked the first time the two have had a transfer of ownership of a health facility. The sale was designed to be a mutually beneficial transaction that will maintain and enhance the high level of patient care based in Okmulgee.

A first-ever grant from the GRAMMY Foundation to OU's American Organ Institute Archive and Library allowed for the preservation and public access to a unique organ recording collection. The \$20,000 grant allowed the institute to restore the collection's most treasured items. The collection consists of 760 original and irreplaceable master organ player rolls (weighing in at 16 tons) produced by the Möller Pipe Organ Co. in the early 1920s, including organ arrangements by notable performers of the 20th century.

A \$60,000 gift from the OU Athletics Department budget allowed the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art to begin offering complimentary admission to the public.

Delta Dental of Oklahoma Oral Health Foundation made a \$3.2 million gift commitment in January 2013 to the College of Dentistry's \$20 million Legacy Project capital campaign. The largest private fundraising effort in the college's history, the campaign is focused on creating a state-of-the-art facility to train tomorrow's dental professionals. Additionally, the Health Sciences Center administration and University Hospitals Authority and Trust each provided \$3.2 million to the project.

For its ongoing efforts to improve the health of its faculty, staff and students, the OU Norman campus was selected as a Certified Healthy Campus and achieved the highest of three levels of certification: Excellence. Certified Healthy Campus is a program of the Shape Your Future Campaign coordinated by the Oklahoma Turning Point Council, formed in 1997 to help transform public health in the state by working directly with community partnerships on health improvement initiatives.

A manuscript written by a leading astronomer in Rome at the height of Galileo's astronomical discoveries that was described as "rare, important and beautiful" was acquired for OU's History of Science Collections. In September 2012, the OU Athletics Department presented OU and the History of Science Collections with a \$500,000 endowment to support exhibits and acquire rare works for the History of Science Collections; this partnership enabled the purchase of the manuscript, *Tractatus de sphaera*, by Oratio Grassi.

The OU College of Law was named one of the top 15 "Best Law Schools" in the nation by *National Jurist* magazine. OU was the only Oklahoma law school included and was among such institutions as Yale, Stanford, Harvard, the University of California-Berkeley, and the University of Virginia.

To foster the continued growth and expansion of biomedical research and related commercial efforts that further health care, OU purchased the Presbyterian Health Foundation Research Park in Oklahoma City. Stanton L. Young and the Presbyterian Health Foundation, working with the Oklahoma City Urban Renewal Authority, began putting together the land on which the Research Park was built in the mid-1980s with the hope of building a state-of-the-art research park tied to the medical center.

The Price College of Business entrepreneurship program was listed in the top two in the nation among public universities in ratings released by The Princeton Review, an education services company. The interim dean of the college noted that OU was one of only three public universities in the United States to achieve high marks from Businessweek, U.S. News & World Report and The Princeton Review.

In the aftermath of the deadly and destructive May 20 tornado in Moore, thousands of donors reached out with gifts totaling more than \$213,000 to Help OU's Neighbor, a fund created to provide short-term and immediate aid to OU faculty, staff and students in disaster situations. The Help OU's Neighbor fund allowed OU to provide gift cards and cash to take care of immediate expenses. President David Boren and First Lady Molly Shi Boren set up an action line so callers could help OU identify families and students in need. Meanwhile, gifts poured in from across the nation in amounts from \$1 to \$50,000, the latter contributed anonymously. Some of the gifts arrived from unexpected places. The Texas A&M softball team contributed, as did international students who had returned to their homelands and transplanted Sooners on both coasts. In the weeks that followed the tornado, more than 300 Sooners received aid through the fund.

The OU Foundation was one of three university foundations to be named as beneficiaries of a stock gift valued at approximately \$70 million each. Officials of Oklahoma City-based Dolese Bros. Co. publicly announced that the company has donated much of the private company's stock to the schools through each institution's foundation. At OU, the gift supports retention scholarships and other effective methods of increasing the engineering workforce.

1890 to Present

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- 1890 On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
- 1891 First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
- 1892 David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president of the University of Oklahoma.
- On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.
- 1893 First college freshman enrolled.
- School of Pharmacy founded in response to demands for pharmacists in the territory.
- First annual catalog published; four departments were advertised: Preparatory, Collegiate, Pharmaceutical, and Musical.
- 1894 Oklahoma Historical Society organized.
- 1896 First degree -- that of Pharmaceutical Chemist -- conferred.
- 1897 The first OU newspaper, *The Umpire*, began operations.
- 1898 First Bachelor of Arts degree conferred.
- University created four new divisions: Graduate work, Premedical work, School of Music, and the Summer School.
- First graduate students enrolled.
- 1899 Alumni Association organized.
- Territorial legislature authorized creation of a department of Geology and Natural History, which later became the Geological Survey.
- First honorary degree conferred.
- 1900 First Master of Arts degree conferred.
- First medical instruction offered.
- 1901 Major elective system, with prescribed work in English, French, or German, biology or chemistry, and history was adopted by College of Arts and Sciences.
- 1902 School of Fine Arts established from School of Music.
- 1903 First Bachelor of Science degree conferred.
- Funds donated by Andrew Carnegie for the construction of a university library.
- 1904 School of Applied Science with curricula in mechanical, electrical, and civil engineering established.
- First Rhodes Scholar from OU chosen.
- 1905 Publication of the first OU yearbook, *The Mistletoe*, began.
- First social fraternity (Kappa Alpha) chartered.

- 1906 First Master of Science degree conferred.
- 1907 President Theodore Roosevelt issued proclamation admitting Oklahoma as the forty-sixth state of the Union. OU automatically became the state university.
- 1908 President Boyd dismissed. A. Grant Evans became second President of OU.
- 1909 University reorganized into the Graduate School, College of Arts and Sciences, School of Fine Arts, School of Pharmacy, College of Engineering, and School of Medicine.
School of Law organized.
Faculty Senate organized.
First sororities (Kappa Alpha Theta and Delta Delta Delta) chartered.
- 1910 School of Teaching organized in the College of Arts and Sciences.
Preparatory School discontinued.
School of Medicine merged with Epworth College of Medicine, with the first two years of School of Medicine continued on the Norman campus and the third and fourth years to be carried on at Oklahoma City.
- 1911 School of Nursing established.
First Doctor of Medicine degrees conferred.
President Evans resigned; Dean Julien Monnet of the Law School became Acting President.
The State Board of Education became governing board of the university.
- 1912 First law degrees conferred.
State University Hospital opened in Oklahoma City and operated a Training School for Nurses.
Stratton D. Brooks became President of OU.
- 1913 School of Journalism and School of Commerce and Industry organized in College of Arts and Sciences.
University Extension Division organized for distance learning.
- 1916 *The Oklahoma Daily*, first daily student newspaper, began operations.
- 1917 Student Loan Aid Association incorporated.
- 1919 School of Home Economics established in College of Arts and Sciences.
The Seventh Legislature repealed provision that made State Board of Education the Board of Regents and set up a new and separate Board of Regents for OU.
- 1920 Phi Beta Kappa chapter established at OU.
School of Education became independent school.
- 1922 Campus radio station (WNAD) went on the air.
- 1923 President Brooks resigned. Dean Buchanan of College of Arts and Sciences became Acting President, became President the following year.

- 1923 School of Business (formerly School of Commerce and Industry) organized as an independent school.
Oklahoma Geological Survey abolished.

University of Oklahoma Press established.
School of Library Science established in College of Arts and Sciences.
Schools of Education and Business elevated to college status.
New University Library completed.
- 1931 First Doctor of Education degree conferred.
First visiting professor came to OU.
Appropriations for Geological Survey discontinued.
- 1932 School of General Engineering and School of Natural Gas Engineering organized in College of Engineering.
- 1935 AMA withdrew accreditation from Medical School, primarily because of political interference by governor admitting chiropractors to practice at University Hospital.
Oklahoma Geological Survey reopened.
- 1936 Museum of Art established.

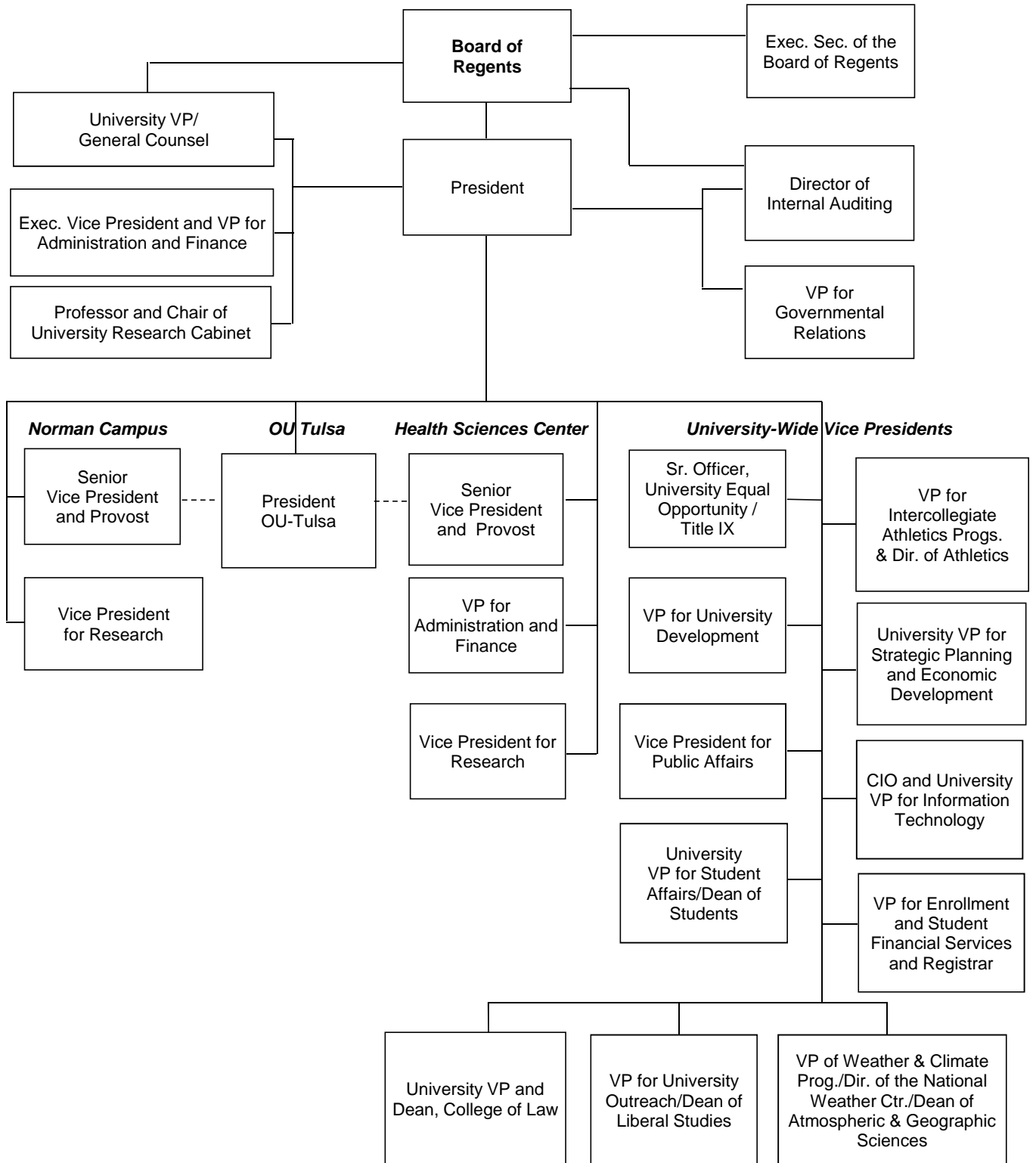

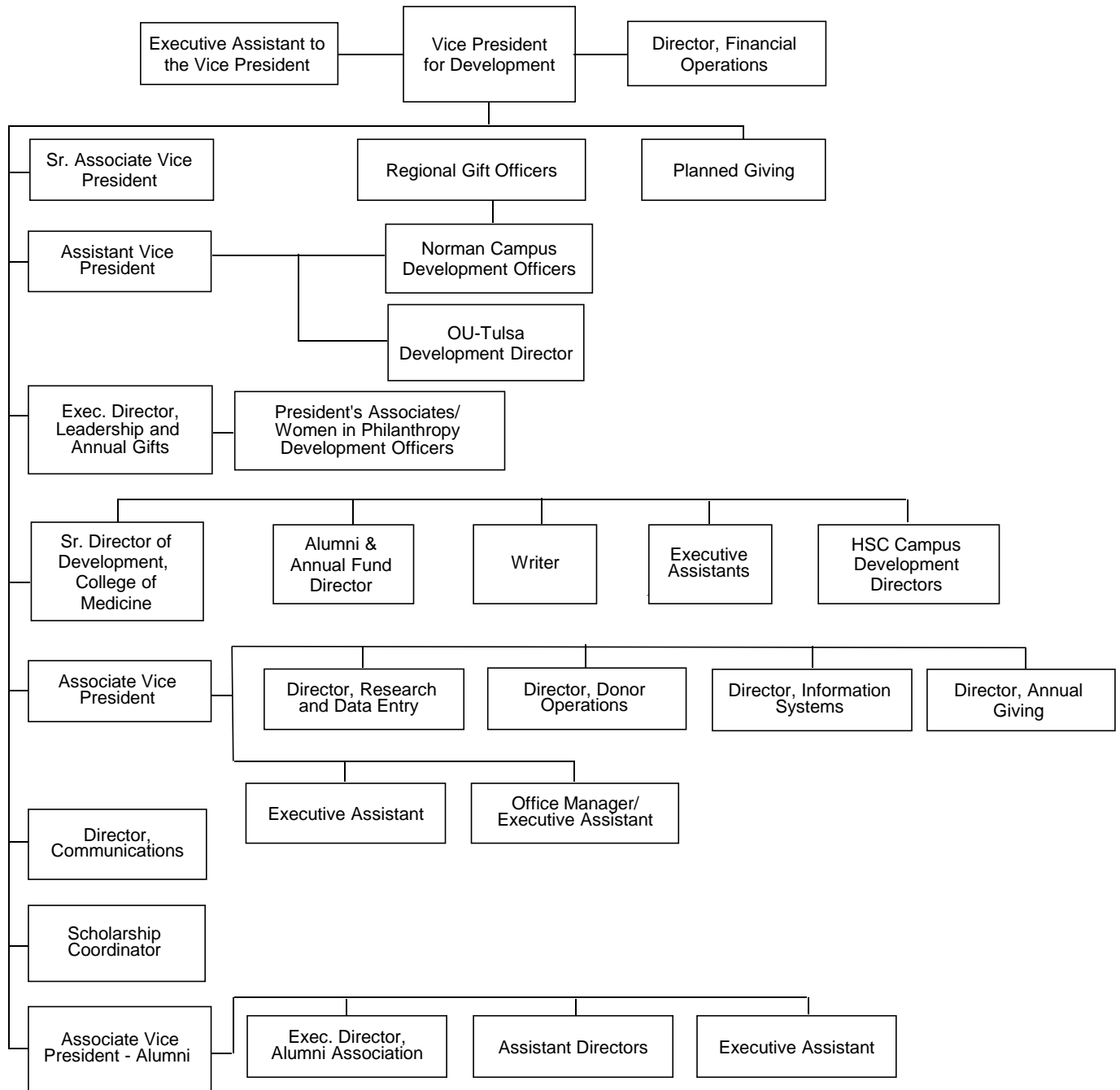

University Development Organizational Chart

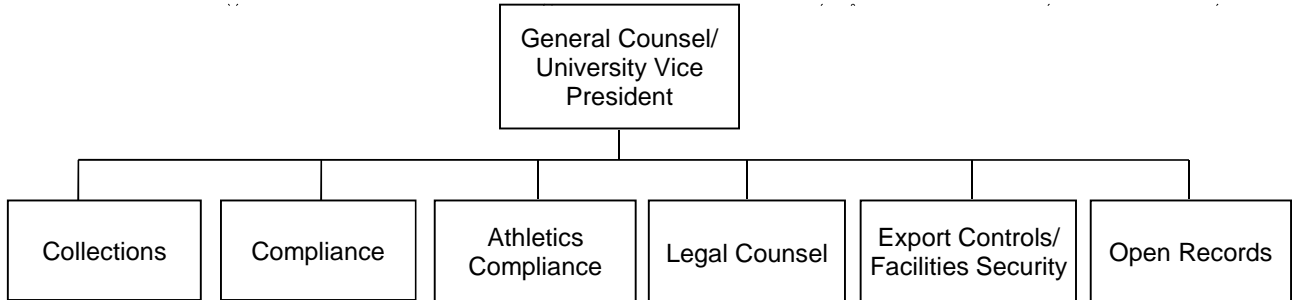

General Counsel Organization Chart

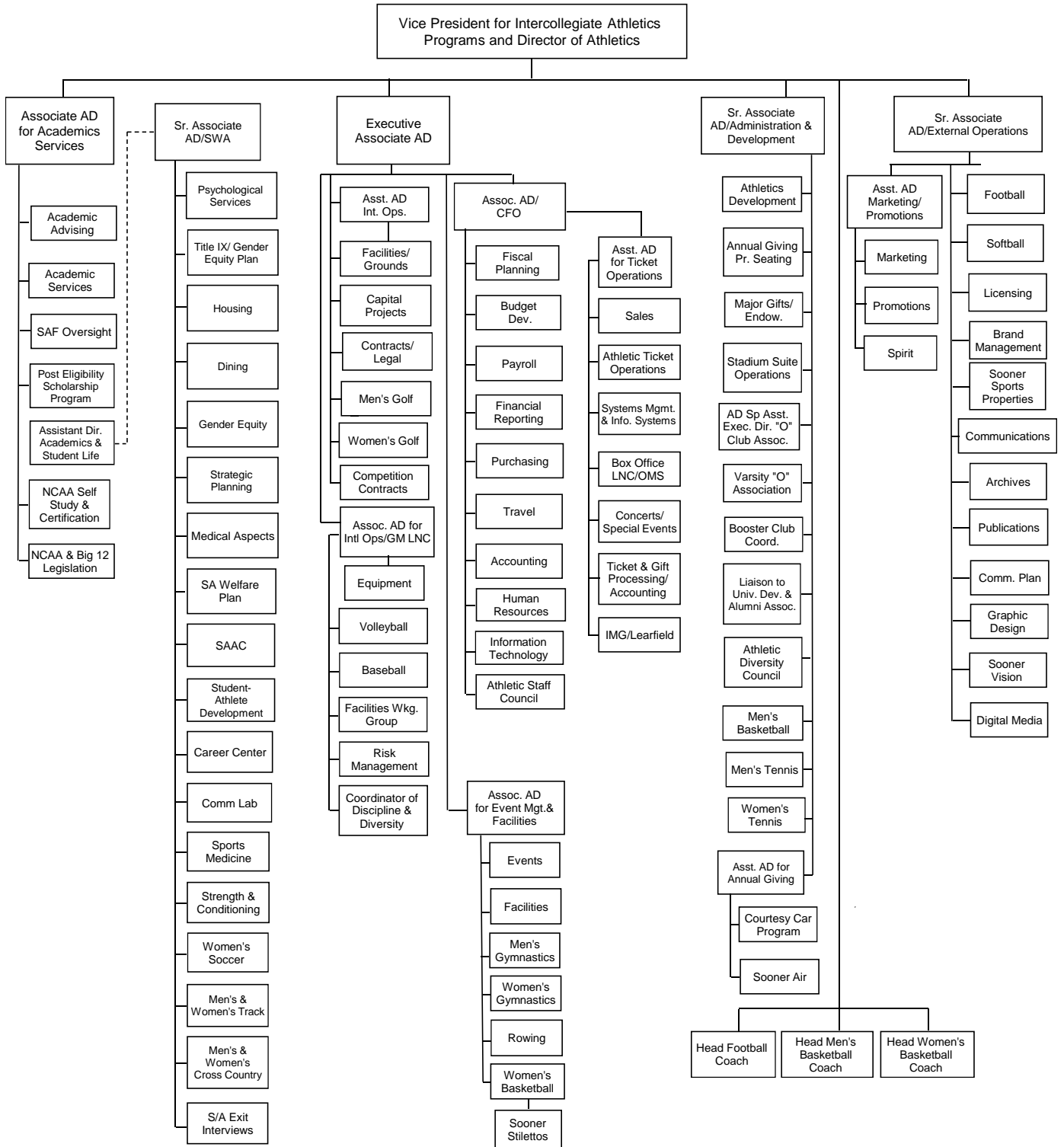

University Outreach Organizational Chart

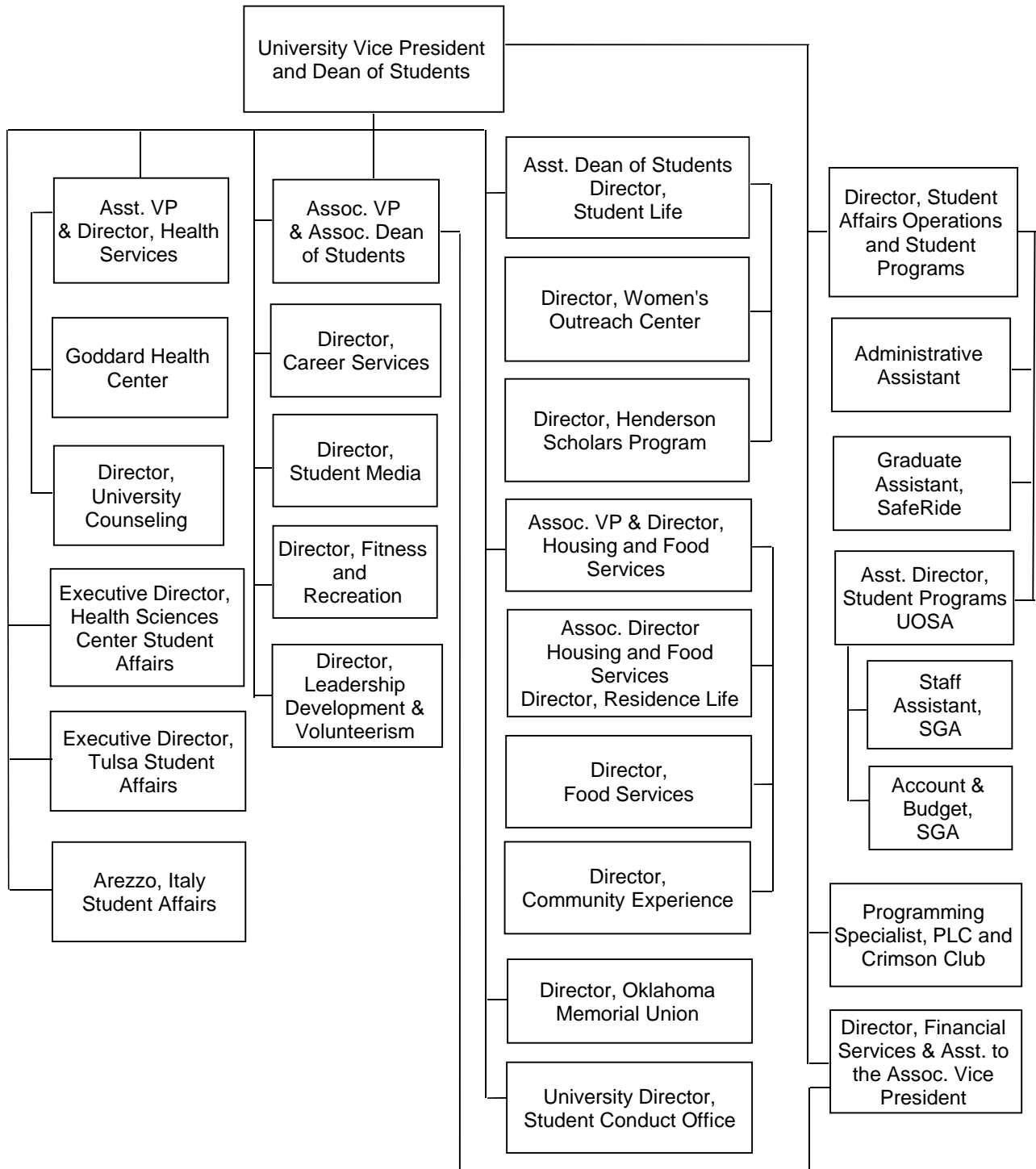

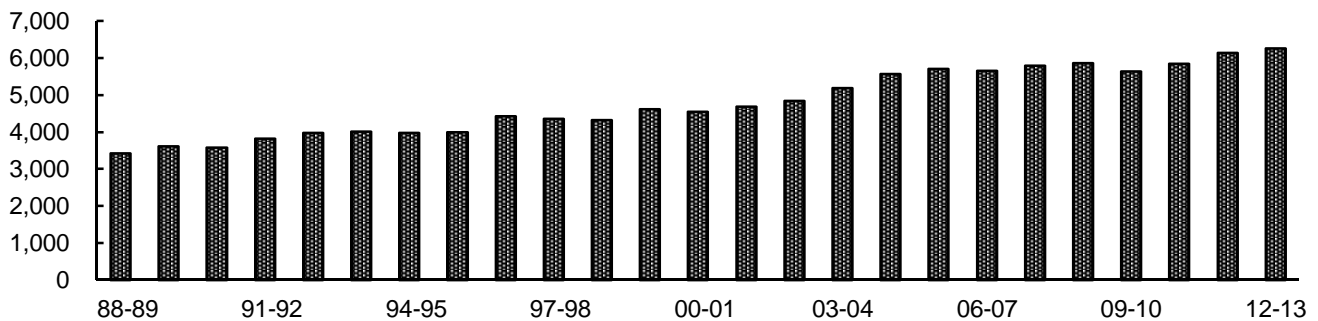

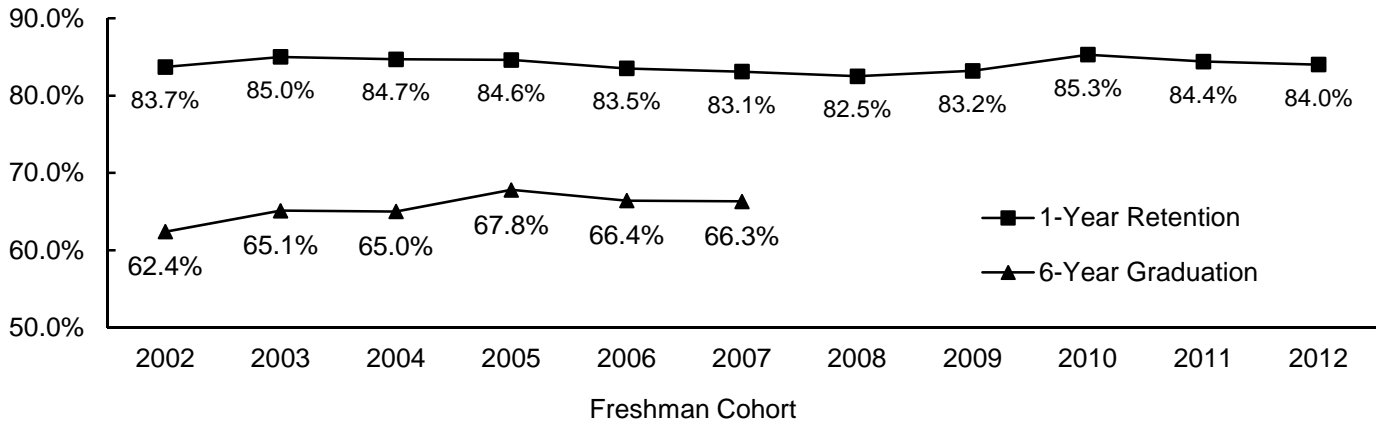

Retention and Graduation Rates



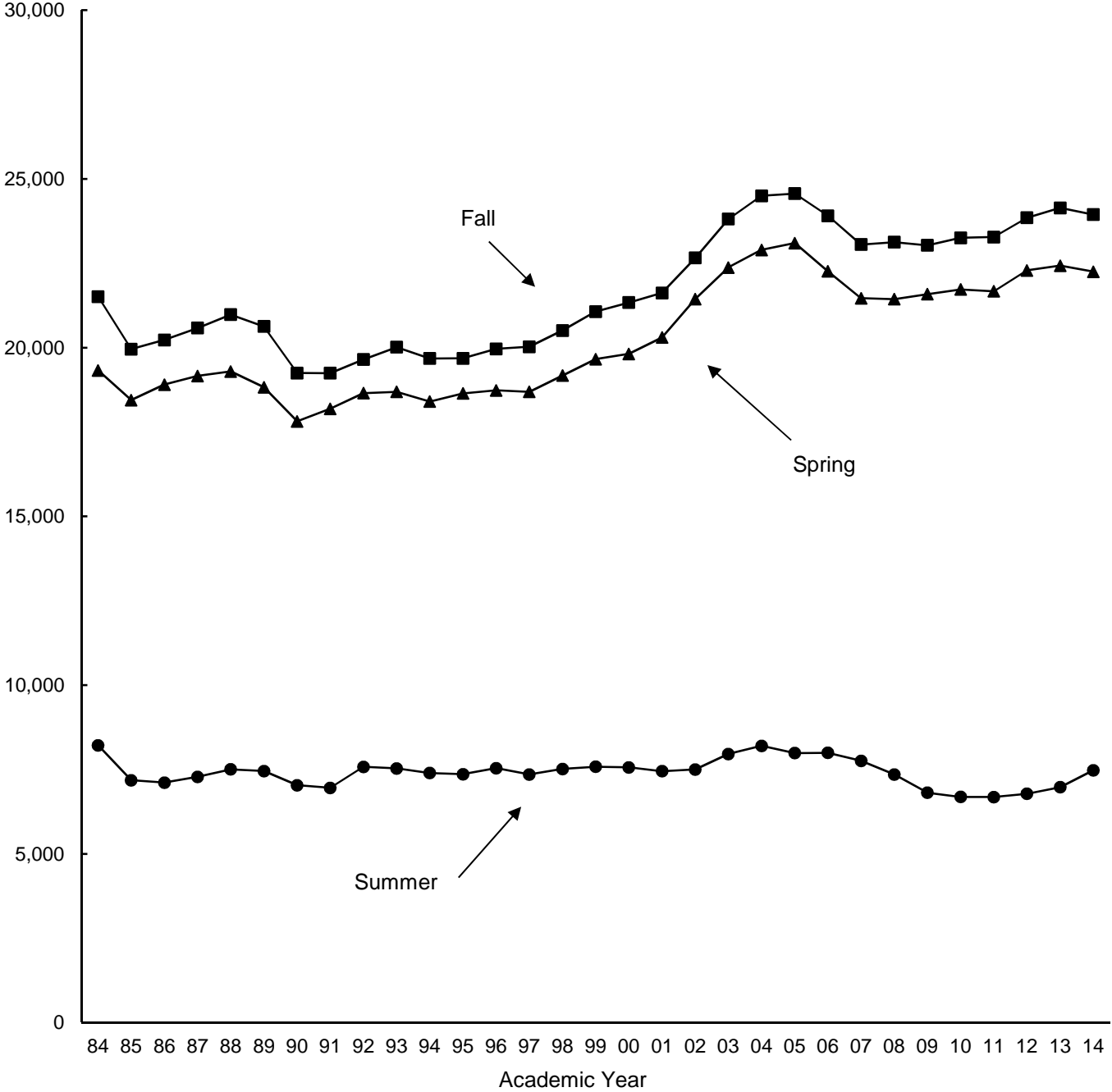

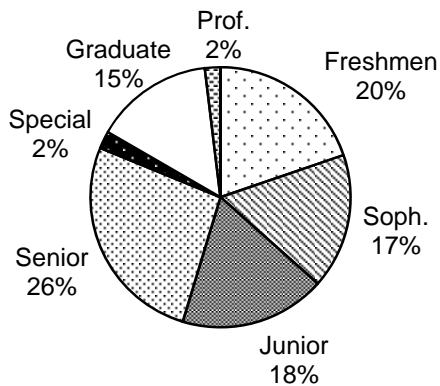
Enrollment by Class within College

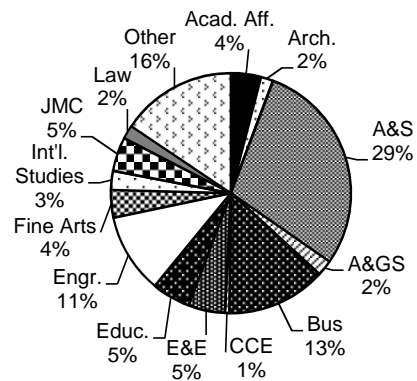

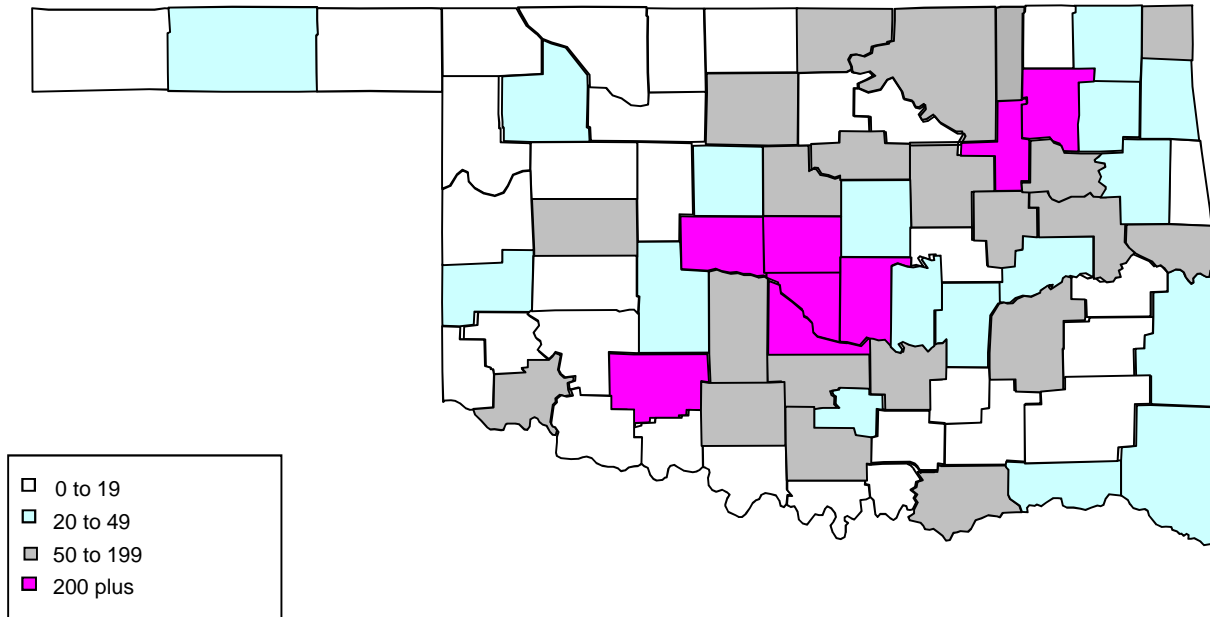

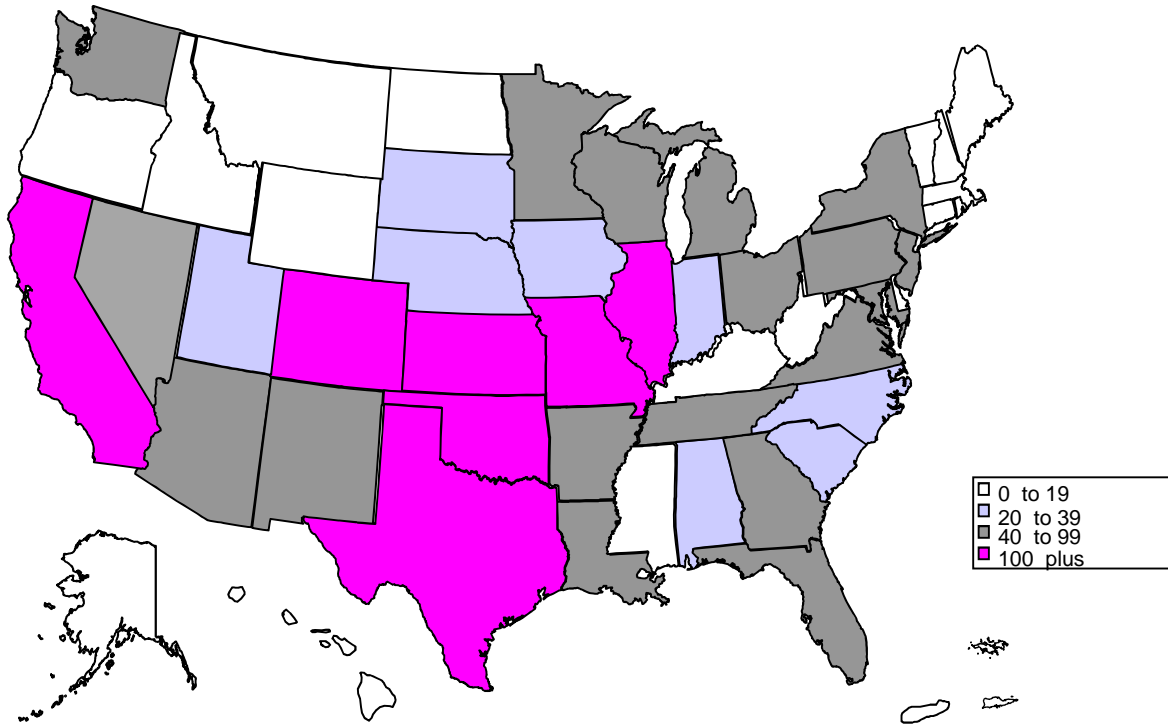

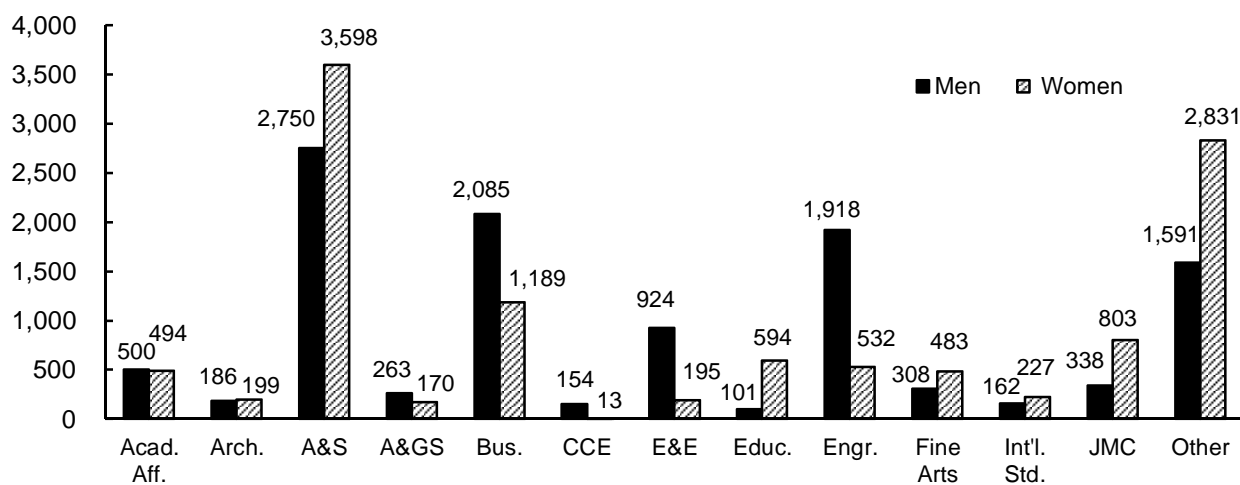

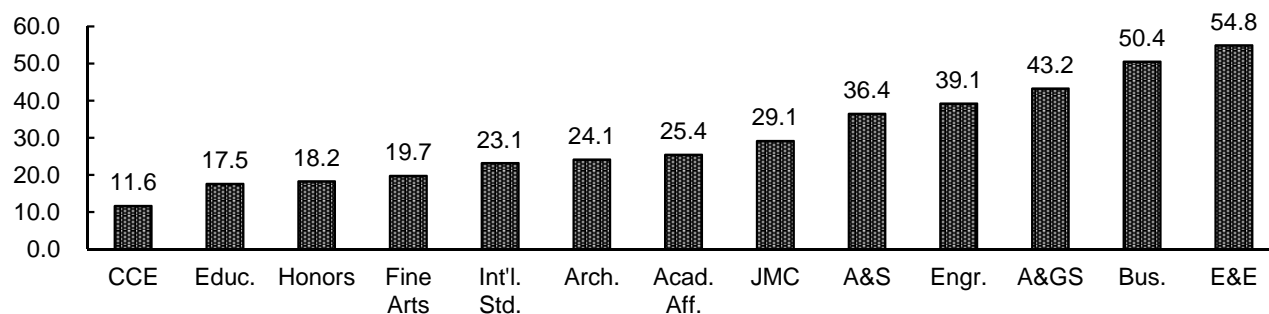

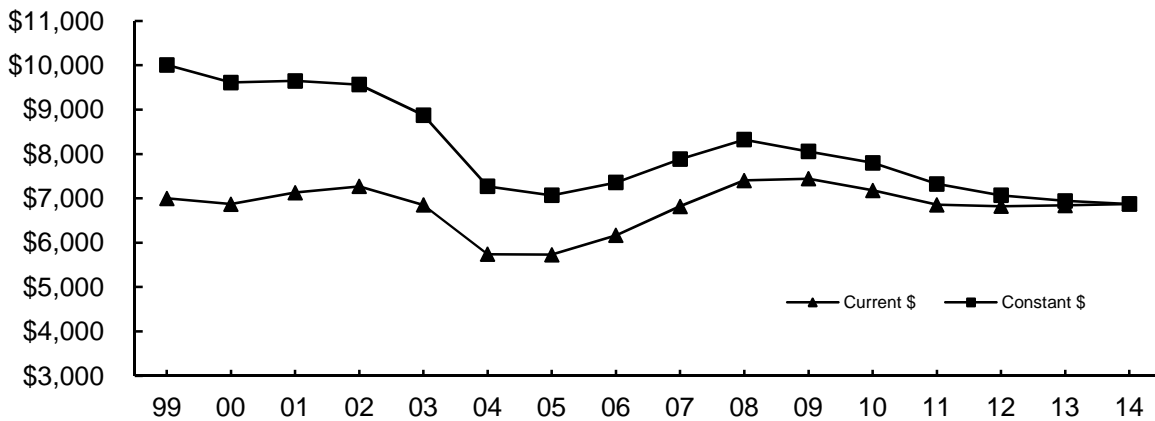

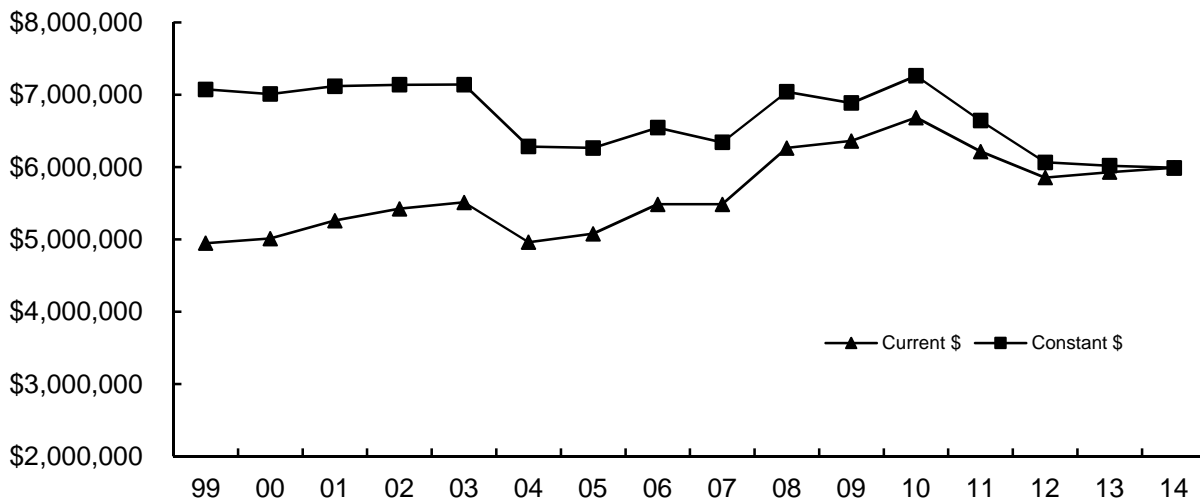

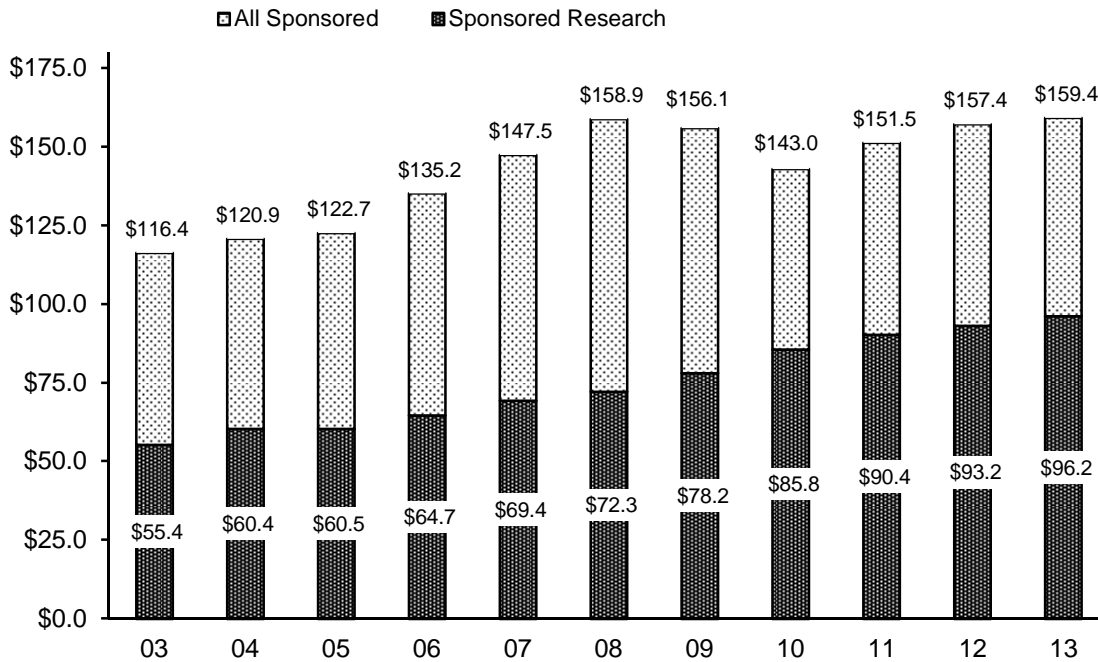

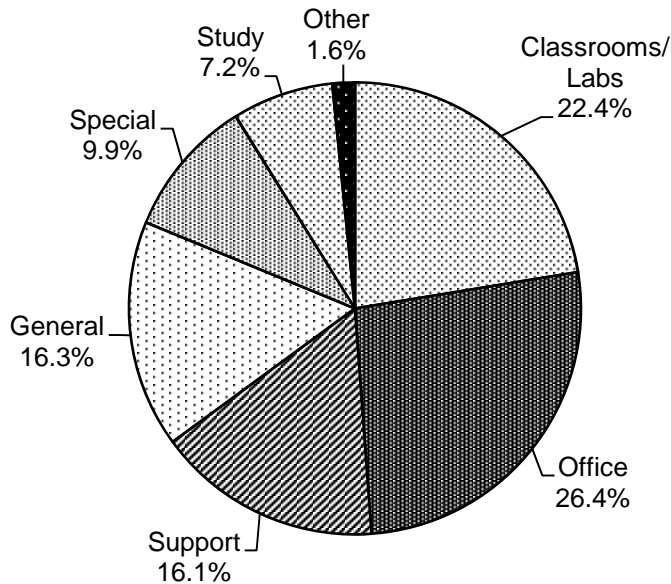

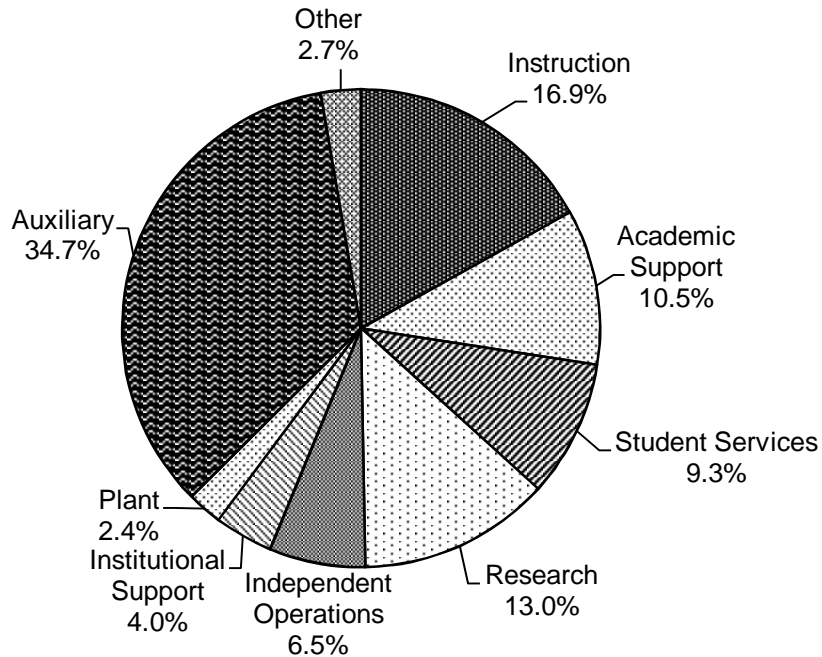

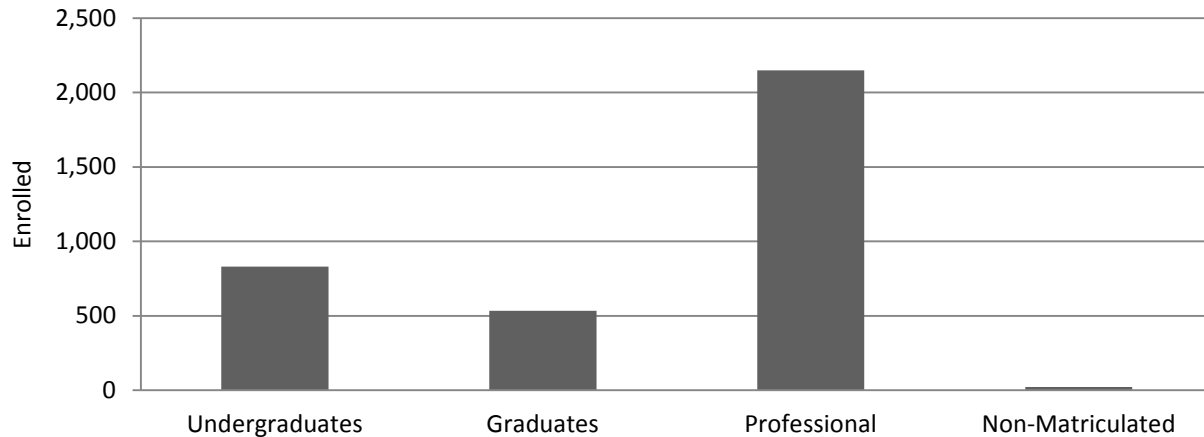

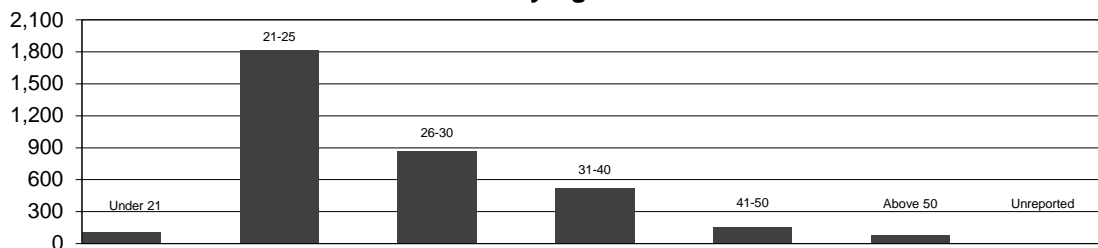

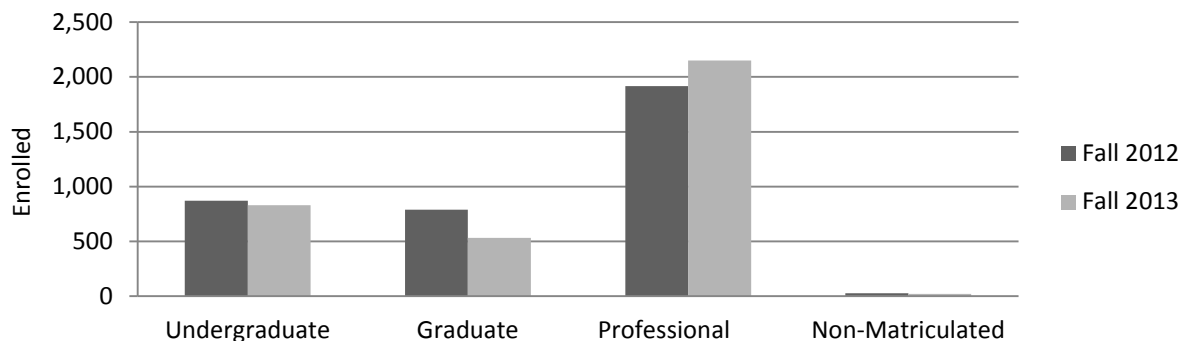

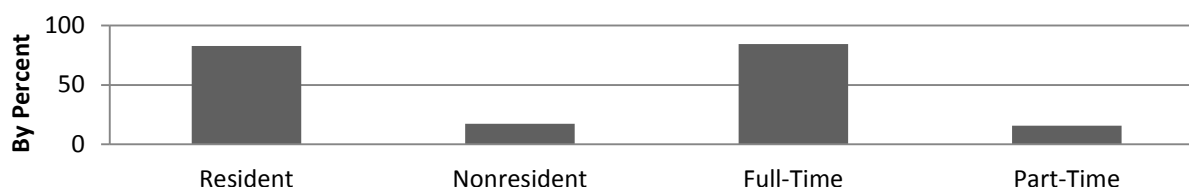

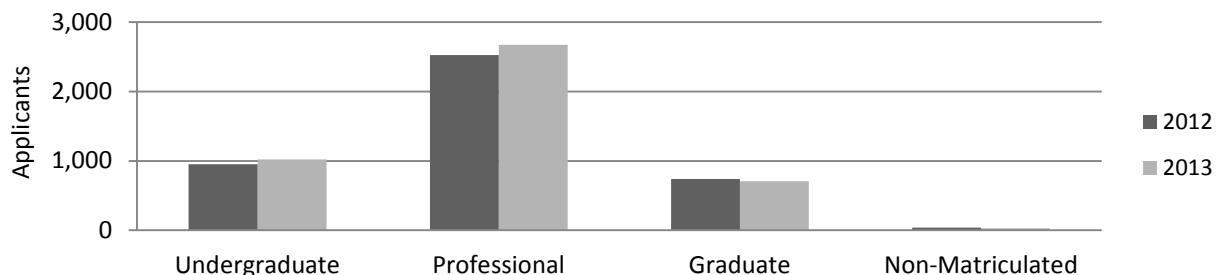

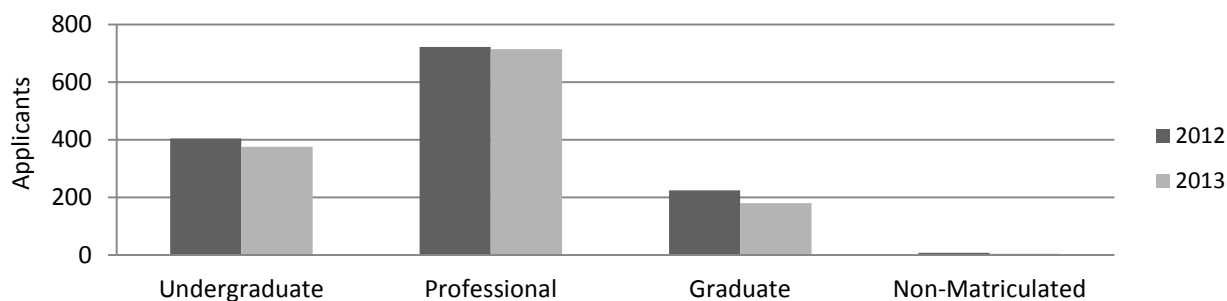

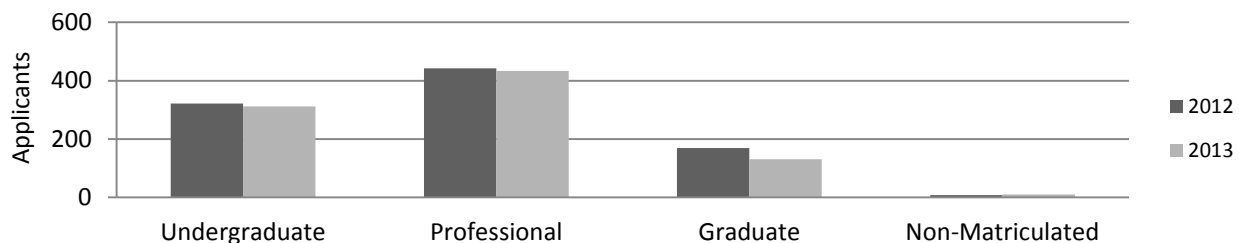

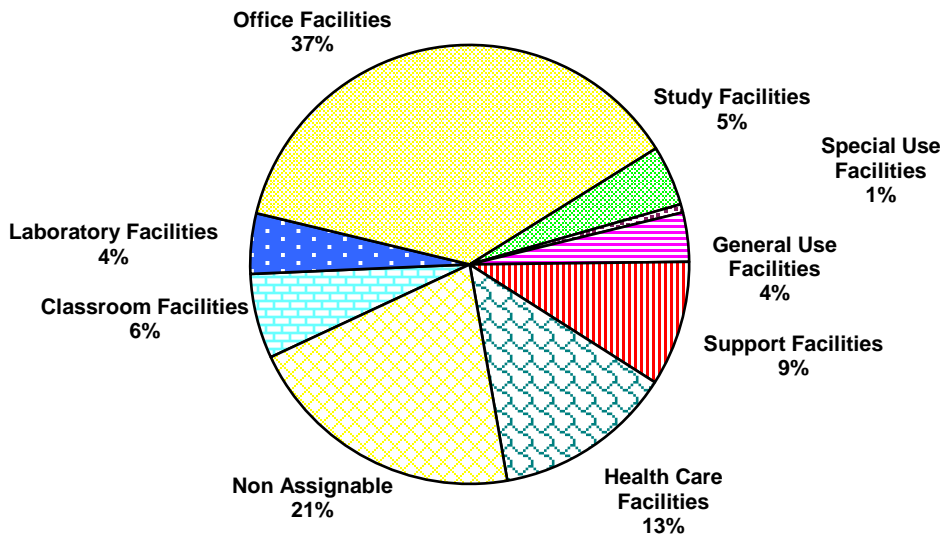
