

#### UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university – as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations – places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma State Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

#### NORMAN CAMPUS

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the Christopher C. Gibbs College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the Gallogly College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Honors College, the College of International Studies, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Professional and Continuing Studies - OU Extended Campus. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state.

The Norman campus consists of four sections – central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls, which includes residential colleges and other upperclassman housing; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Donald W. Reynolds Performing Arts Center, including historic Holmberg Hall; Rupel Jones Fine Arts Center, including Elsie C. Brackett Theatre; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Sarkeys Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

#### South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the College of Law; the OU Foundation; OU Traditions apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Gregg Wadley Tennis Pavilion; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hynes Field – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; the OU Rugby Field; the OU Rowing Training Center; and the OU Learning Center.

#### **Research Campus**

In less than a decade, the 277-acre OU Research Campus has been transformed from an empty field to a thriving economic engine shaped by a community of public and private sector collaborations located in nearly 1 million square feet of occupied space representing \$300 million in investment. Today, the Research Campus brings together 1,700 workers across academic, federal, state and industrial organizations in a mutually beneficial environment.

#### Research Campus (continued)

The National Weather Center, a 257,000 square-foot facility that opened in 2006, anchors the OU Research Campus on the south. The Center houses both academic and federal groups dedicated to forecasting, research and training. The Stephenson Research and Technology Center and the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center house cutting-edge research in fields including robotics, genomics, bioengineering and the OU Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, which includes a National Institutes of Health-funded structural biology program. A series of five "Partners Place" buildings, totaling 362,000 square-feet, enable the public and private sector collaboration on weather and radar research; innovation and entrepreneurship; and water, climate, and energy. The new OU Innovation Hub serves as a creative space for students and faculty in support of invention and entrepreneurship. Additionally, a 35,000 square-foot "one of a kind" Radar Innovations Laboratory opened in 2014.

OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which allows the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria. OU's Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks, placing it among such past recipients as Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, Purdue Research Park in Indiana and University City Science Center in Pennsylvania.

#### North Campus

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a state agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

#### HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. It is one of only four comprehensive academic health centers in the nation with seven professional colleges. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use clinical, research and teaching facilities at OU Medical Center, The Children's Hospital, Stephenson Cancer Center, Harold Hamm Diabetes Center, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute and other affiliated health organizations in Oklahoma City, Tulsa and communities across the state. The OU Health Sciences Center is located on the Oklahoma Health Center campus, which is also home to the University Research Park and 30 other biomedical entities.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

The Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center represents the largest public-private biomedical initiative in Oklahoma history. The 210,000-square-foot facility provides patient-centered care by the largest and most experienced group of cancer specialists, offering the most advanced cancer detection and treatment technology. OU's Harold Hamm Diabetes Center is one of the top comprehensive diabetes centers in the world for adults and children with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, engaging in novel research aimed at progress toward a cure for diabetes and its complications.

## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

#### OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize strong campus-community partnerships and leverage unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa City-County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the Tulsa campus enrolls medical students and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of Medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine. The University of Tulsa and the University of Oklahoma welcomed its first class of students to the School of Community Medicine four-year educational track in Tulsa in 2015. The Tandy Education Center also recently opened and is a space that provides students the opportunity to practice lifelike circumstances using models and virtual reality. It is a state-of-the-art facility that features the latest advances in medical simulation.

#### OU EXTENDED CAMPUS - COLLEGE OF PROFESSIONAL AND CONTINUING STUDIES

OU Extended Campus - College of Professional and Continuing Studies (PACS) exists to provide access to transformational, world-class University of Oklahoma degrees, certifications, and programs for a diverse group of learners. OU Extended Campus is best characterized by the populations it serves, as well as the specialized academic programming it offers. Primarily focusing on the higher education needs of place-bound working adults, military-connected personnel, and those seeking specialized study in selected professional areas (such as Aviation), the College offers a variety of degrees at both graduate and undergraduate levels, including several programs offered collaboratively with other OU Colleges, and utilizing a variety of delivery modes (fully online, hybrid, onsite, cohort-based, etc.). To facilitate understanding of the complex world in which we live and building on its historical roots, the College emphasizes a holistic approach to learning, focuses on the immediate application of learning to one's life and work, promotes lifelong learning opportunities, and encourages the work of active citizenship.

While its programs were originally developed for adult and non-traditional students, many of the seminars, colloquia, and conferences offered by the College also serve students enrolled in conventional academic programs, as well as the general public. Therefore, in addition to the full-time degree program offerings noted above, PACS is also committed to meeting the educational needs of a wide variety of learners and organizations seeking smaller scale academic options, including credit courses, workshops, academic conferences, certification programs, executive academic programs and academically-oriented professional training services.

In January, David Boren began his 50th year of public service, as governor of Oklahoma, U.S. Senator, member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and as OU president. In September, Boren announced plans to retire as president, effective June 30, 2018.

For the second year in a row, OU set an all-time record in freshman-to-sophomore retention. Of first-year students entering OU in Fall 2016, 92.1 percent returned for their sophomore year in fall 2017. This places OU in the top 30 public research institutions in the nation currently reporting retention rates of 92 percent or higher.

OU was recognized as one of the top three campuses in the nation with the "Happiest Students," according to The Princeton Review's latest rankings of the 382 best colleges. OU was also ranked No. 11 for "Best Quality of Life," No. 5 for "Students Pack the Stadiums," and No. 14 for "Best College Library."

OU was ranked among the top institutions in the nation, both public and private, for its online degree programs. U.S. News & World Report recognized OU as No. 2 in the category of "Best Online Bachelor's Programs for Veterans," which also includes programs for active duty soldiers. OU was ranked No. 3 in the overall category of "Best Online Bachelor's Programs" and tied for No. 5 in the category of "Best Online Graduate Criminal Justice Programs."

For the second year in a row, OU was a recipient of the 2017 Higher Education Excellence in Diversity Award, the only national award honoring individual colleges or universities for their outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion across their campuses. The HEED Award is given by INSIGHT Into Diversity, the largest and oldest diversity and inclusion publication in higher education.

OU dedicated its first Residential Colleges, Dunham College and Headington College, in a public ceremony Oct. 11. Patterned after those at Harvard, Yale, Oxford and Cambridge, OU was the first university in the state and one of the first public universities in the nation to adopt the residential college model. The Residential Colleges provide an intimate and supportive community designed to promote the social, intellectual and personal growth of OU undergraduates.

OU received \$304,227,798 in private gifts and gifts-in-kind in the 2017 fiscal year. Included in the total gifts for the fiscal year were those of the annual Campus Campaign, in which more than 2,545 faculty, staff and retirees contributed \$2,317,448 to support scholarships and programs across all three OU campuses.

In December, President Boren announced a lead gift from Christopher C. Gibbs to establish an endowment to support and enhance existing College of Architecture programs and operations. The gift – the largest in the college's history – also funded new scholarly initiatives and student opportunities, expanding the college's ability to support graduate and undergraduate students, industry professionals, entrepreneurs and community members.

Bizzell Memorial Library, built in 1929, was named among 18 stunning university libraries around the world, according to Architectural Digest. OU was the only Big 12 University to be recognized.

In September, the Graduate School of Business at the Michael F. Price College of Business was named in honor of H.E. "Gene" Rainbolt to honor a major gift from the Rainbolt family. This gift is the second-largest in Price College's history. A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on Nov. 10 at the recently renovated facility, home to the Michael F. Price College of Business's full-time and professional MBA programs, its growing executive education programs, and the Oklahoma City location for the Ronnie K. Irani Center for the Creation of Economic Wealth and the Office of Technology Development, two components of the college's Entrepreneurship and Economic Development Division.

OU set two Guinness World Records<sup>™</sup> titles for the largest human image of a cloud and the largest human image of a lightning bolt. Both were featured in a March 27 live national broadcast with NBC's TODAY correspondent Al Roker as part of Rokerthon 3: Storming Into The Madness, held at The Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. More than 800 OU students formed the two weather elements on Owen Field.

The A. Max Weitzenhoffer School of Musical Theatre was recognized as one of the top musical theatre programs in the country by American Theatre magazine. The national publication compiled a list of the top 13 colleges and universities outside the New York City metropolitan area that continually work to modify, adapt and reshape degree programs by offering unique coursework that provides students the opportunity to distinguish themselves in an everchanging form of theatrical performance. Both private and public colleges and universities were included in the list. OU was the only school in Oklahoma and the only school in the Big 12 to be selected.

The Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History was named one of the top 50 most impressive college museums - public or private - according to College Values Online. OU was the only school in Oklahoma to be selected.

The Sam Noble Museum also received the prestigious 2017 University Museums and Collections Award from the International Council of Museums, which was presented in Helsinki, Finland. The museum program recognized for the award is the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair, a program that for 15 years has reached thousands of young Native Americans across Oklahoma and the Southwest.

The University of Oklahoma was one of only three colleges to be honored with a 2017 CIO 100 Award, recognizing 100 organizations nationwide that have distinguished themselves by creating business value through the effective and innovative use of information technology.

The University of Oklahoma was 2017's Big 12 Conference Champion of the College and University Green Power Challenge for using more green power than any other school in the conference, according to rankings just released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

OU President David Boren announced a lead gift to the university to create the Alliance for Integrative Approaches to Extreme Environmental Events, a community-led collaboration that will improve understanding, prediction of, and response to extreme environmental events such as severe storms and tornadoes.

The College of Liberal Studies was renamed the College of Professional and Continuing Studies. The College combines the academic and credit-related activities of University Outreach into a single administrative unit. The new name more appropriately represents the diverse group of lifelong learners within the college.

OU was awarded with a silver Bicycle Friendly University designation by the League of American Bicyclists. Cycling options at OU had advanced due to numerous campus improvements, such as the development of Crimson Cruisers, OU's bike share program, new bike lanes and more resources for cyclists on campus.

In October 2017, OU Physicians in Tulsa announced the purchase of a new practice location at 106th and Memorial in south Tulsa.

The OU-Tulsa Office of Community Engagement was established to create an infrastructure that supports and advances community engagement efforts across colleges, departments and programs at OU-Tulsa.

Stuart Square opened at OU-Tulsa. Funded from a grant from the Stuart Family Foundation, Stuart Square is centrally located on campus and provides opportunities for faculty, staff and students to enjoy the outdoors.

The OU-TU School of Community Medicine hosted 104 participants for the 10th annual Summer Institute, a fourday immersive experience that demonstrates the interrelated health and poverty issues our community faces.

OU-Tulsa raised more than \$22,000 in 24 hours for student scholarships during OU's inaugural Giving Day.

The Tandy Education Center at OU-Tulsa delivered 1,556 hours of simulation training.

More than 1,200 individuals received free medical care from the Bedlam Community Health Clinics.

The Early Childhood Education Institute at OU-Tulsa collaborated with Georgetown and Harvard for a large-scale longitudinal study following children from age 3 through third grade.

The University of Oklahoma

- 1890 On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
- 1891 First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
- 1892 David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president of the University of Oklahoma.

On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.

1893 First college freshman enrolled.

School of Pharmacy founded in response to demands for pharmacists in the territory.

First annual catalog published; four departments were advertised: Preparatory, Collegiate, Pharmaceutical, and Musical.

- 1894 Oklahoma Historical Society organized.
- 1896 First degree -- that of Pharmaceutical Chemist -- conferred.
- 1897 The first OU newspaper, *The Umpire*, began operations.
- 1898 First Bachelor of Arts degree conferred.

University created four new divisions: Graduate work, Premedical work, School of Music, and the Summer School.

First graduate students enrolled.

Territorial legislature authorized creation of a department of Geology and Natural History, which later became the Geological Survey.

First honorary degree conferred.

A first-ever grant from the GRAMMY Foundation to OU's American Organ Institute Archive and Library allowed for the preservation and public access to a unique organ recording collection. The collection consists of 760 original and irreplaceable master organ player rolls produced by the Möller Pipe Organ Company in the early 1920s.

The Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art began offering complimentary admission to the public, due to a gift from the OU Athletics Department.

OU's History of Science Collections acquired *Tractatus de sphaera*, a manuscript written by Oratio Grassi, a leading astronomer in Rome at the height of Galileo's astronomical discoveries.

2014 OU was the only Big 12 university selected as having one of America's 25 most beautiful campuses.

The Radar Innovations Laboratory was dedicated in a public ceremony.

The Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History was awarded the 2014 National Medal for Museum and Library Service.

The first ever anaerobic structural biology program in the United States was created. The OU-Einstein Research Consortium's focus would be on advancing groundbreaking research with biomedical relevance in an unexplored area and would establish an Institute of Structural Biology in the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center on OU's Research Campus.

The lower level of the Neustadt Wing of Bizzell Memorial Library was renovated to create the Peggy V. Helmerich Collaborative Learning Center.

OU was selected to serve as Secretariat for the U.S. Department of State's Diplomacy Lab program. As Secretariat, OU would serve as the coordinator for all universities selected to participate in the nationwide program.

The University of Oklahoma achieved an 80 percent graduation rate overall for student-athletes, the highest mark ever recorded by the Sooners since the NCAA began tracking this data.

2015 OU became the first public university in U.S. history to be ranked No. 1 in freshman National Merit Scholars enrolled.

The College of Nursing was named in honor of OU alumni Fran and Earl Ziegler of Dallas, Texas.

OU-Tulsa opened the Tandy Education Center, a \$6.4 million, state-of the art simulation and education facility.

The Elsie C. Brackett Theatre, a renovated theater in the Rupel J. Jones Fine Arts Center that was originally completed in 1965, opened in October.

OU dedicated the newly renovated Hester Hall, home of the OU College of International Studies, in a public ceremony in April.

2016 OU is the only public university in U.S. history to ever rank first among both public and private universities in the number of freshman National Merit Scholars.

OU has the academically highest ranked student body at a public university in Oklahoma history.

OU achieved an all-time record freshman-to-sophomore retention rate of 90 percent, ranking OU among the top universities in the nation.

OU is the only public university in Oklahoma to be included in the Fiske Guide to Colleges, which lists the top 10 percent of all U.S. universities.

OU has produced 29 Rhodes Scholars; no other university in Oklahoma has had more than three.

OU is the only university in the nation, public or private, whose students have won Goldwater, Mitchell, Truman, Rhodes, Marshall, Fulbright and National Security Education Program scholarships in the same year.

Hester Hall, home of the College of International Studies, was renamed as Farzaneh Hall and the Iranian Studies Program was renamed as Farzaneh Family Center for Iranian and Persian Gulf Studies.

OU was recently awarded the prestigious Davis Cup for the fourth consecutive year in recognition of its record-setting enrollment of United World College International freshmen. OU is the only public university to ever be awarded the Davis Cup.

For the first time in the history of OU College of Medicine in Tulsa, all four years of medical school were offered at the Schusterman Center through the OU-TU School of Community Medicine.





FY 2003 - 2018





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

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











Distribution of Space by College and Administrative Unit Tulsa Campus







OU Extended Campus - College of Professional and Continuing Studies (PACS) exists to provide access to transformational, world-class University of Oklahoma degrees, certifications, and programs for a diverse group of learners. OU Extended Campus is best characterized by the populations it serves, as well as the specialized academic programming it offers. Primarily focusing on the higher education needs of place-bound working adults, military-connected personnel, and those seeking specialized study in selected professional areas (such as Aviation), the College offers a variety of degrees at both graduate and undergraduate levels, including several programs offered collaboratively with other OU Colleges, and utilizing a variety of delivery modes (fully online, hybrid, onsite, cohort-based, etc.). To facilitate understanding of the complex world in which we live and building on its historical roots, the College emphasizes a holistic approach to learning, focuses on the immediate application of learning to one's life and work, promotes lifelong learning opportunities, and encourages the work of active citizenship.

While its programs were originally developed for adult and non-traditional students, many of the seminars, colloquia, and conferences offered by the College also serve students enrolled in conventional academic programs, as well as the general public. Therefore, in addition to the full-time degree program offerings noted above, PACS is also committed to meeting the educational needs of a wide variety of learners and organizations seeking smaller scale academic options, including credit courses, workshops, academic conferences, certification programs, executive academic programs and academically-oriented professional training services.
