ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university – as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations – places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma State Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

NORMAN CAMPUS

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the Christopher C. Gibbs College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the Gallogly College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Joe C. and Carole Kerr McClendon Honors College, the David L. Boren College of International Studies, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Professional and Continuing Studies. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state.

The Norman campus consists of four sections – central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls, which includes residential colleges and other upperclassman housing; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Donald W. Reynolds Performing Arts Center, including historic Holmberg Hall; Rupel Jones Fine Arts Center, including Elsie C. Brackett Theatre; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Sarkeys Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the College of Law; the OU Foundation; OU Traditions apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Gregg Wadley Tennis Pavilion; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hynes Field – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; the OU Rugby Field; the OU Rowing Training Center; and the OU Learning Center.

Research Campus

In less than a decade, the 277-acre OU Research Campus has been transformed from an empty field to a thriving economic engine shaped by a community of public and private sector collaborations located in nearly 1 million square feet of occupied space representing \$300 million in investment. Today, the Research Campus brings together 1,700 workers across academic, federal, state and industrial organizations in a mutually beneficial environment.

The National Weather Center, a 257,000 square-foot facility that opened in 2006, anchors the OU Research Campus on the south. The Center houses both academic and federal groups dedicated to forecasting, research and training. The Stephenson Research and Technology Center and the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center house cutting-edge research in fields including robotics, genomics, bioengineering and the OU Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, which includes a National Institutes of Health-funded structural biology program. A series of five "Partners Place" buildings, totaling 362,000 square-feet, enable the public and private sector collaboration on weather and radar research; innovation and entrepreneurship; and water, climate, and energy. The OU Innovation Hub serves as a creative space for students and faculty in support of invention and entrepreneurship. Additionally, a 35,000 square-foot "one of a kind" Radar Innovations Laboratory opened in 2014.

OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which allows the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria. OU's Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks, placing it among such past recipients as Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, Purdue Research Park in Indiana and University City Science Center in Pennsylvania.

North Campus

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a state agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center is the state's major educational resource for training physicians, dentists, nurses, pharmacists, public health specialists and a wide range of allied health personnel. It is one of only four comprehensive academic health centers in the nation with seven professional colleges. The center is composed of the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine, the Fran and Earl Ziegler College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, the Hudson College of Public Health and Graduate College.

Faculty and students use clinical, research and teaching facilities at OU Medical Center, The Children's Hospital, Stephenson Cancer Center, Harold Hamm Diabetes Center, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute and other affiliated health organizations in Oklahoma City, Tulsa and communities across the state. The OU Health Sciences Center is located on the Oklahoma Health Center campus, which is also home to the University Research Park and 30 other biomedical entities.

Also housed at the University of Oklahoma is OU Physicians, the state's largest physician group. The practice encompasses nearly every adult and child specialty. Many OU Physicians have expertise in the management of complex conditions. Such expertise is unavailable anywhere else in the state, region or sometimes even the nation. Some have pioneered surgical procedures or innovations in patient care that are world firsts. They also serve as faculty at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and train the region's future physicians.

The Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center represents the largest public-private biomedical initiative in Oklahoma history. The 210,000-square-foot facility provides patient-centered care by the largest and most experienced group of cancer specialists, offering the most advanced cancer detection and treatment technology. OU's Harold Hamm Diabetes Center is one of the top comprehensive diabetes centers in the world for adults and children with type 1 and type 2 diabetes, engaging in novel research aimed at progress toward a cure for diabetes and its complications.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize strong campus-community partnerships and leverage unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa City-County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa enrolls medical students and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of Medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine. The University of Tulsa and the University of Oklahoma welcomed its first class of students to the School of Community Medicine four-year educational track in Tulsa in 2015. The Tandy Education Center also recently opened and is a space that provides students the opportunity to practice lifelike circumstances using models and virtual reality. It is a state-of-the-art facility that features the latest advances in medical simulation.

OU EXTENDED CAMPUS - COLLEGE OF PROFESSIONAL AND CONTINUING STUDIES

OU Extended Campus - College of Professional and Continuing Studies (EC-PACS) exists to provide access to transformational, world-class University of Oklahoma degrees, certifications, and programs for a diverse group of learners. OU Extended Campus is best characterized by the populations it serves, as well as the specialized academic programming it offers. Primarily focusing on the higher education needs of place-bound working adults, military-connected personnel, and those seeking specialized study in selected professional areas (such as Aviation), the College offers a variety of degrees at both graduate and undergraduate levels, including several programs offered collaboratively with other OU Colleges, and utilizing a variety of delivery modes (fully online, hybrid, onsite, cohort-based, etc.). To facilitate understanding of the complex world in which we live and building on its historical roots, the College emphasizes a holistic approach to learning, focuses on the immediate application of learning to one's life and work, promotes lifelong learning opportunities, and encourages the work of active citizenship.

While its programs were originally developed for adult and non-traditional students, many of the activities offered by the College also serve students enrolled in conventional academic programs, as well as the general public. Therefore, in addition to the full-time degree program offerings noted above, EC-PACS is also committed to meeting the educational needs of a wide variety of learners and organizations seeking smaller scale academic options, including credit courses, workshops, academic conferences, certification programs, executive academic programs and academically-oriented professional training services.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2018

The University of Oklahoma

January 2019

James L. "Jim" Gallogly was named the 14th president of the University of Oklahoma on March 26 and assumed the office on July 1. A 1977 alumnus of the OU College of Law, Gallogly was the first-ever CEO from a Fortune 500 company to lead the University.

OU continued its efforts to keep obtaining an education affordable for students. Tuition remained flat for both in-state and out-of-state students and nearly every scholarship for incoming freshmen was increased for the 2019-2020 school year.

As part of its dedication to affordability, OU launched the Crimson Commitment program which, beginning in fall 2019, was to cover tuition and average fees for incoming and current resident students who were recipients of Oklahoma's Promise. The program was an upgrade and replacement of the previous Sooner Promise program.

OU was awarded the Davis Cup for the sixth consecutive year in recognition of its enrollment of United World College international freshmen

An OU junior pursuing a dual major in physics and mathematics was announced as the University's 53rd Goldwater Scholar. A recent OU graduate was named a 2019 Marshall Scholar, OU's seventh since the scholarship began in 1953.

OU received more than \$136.2 million in private cash gifts in the 2018 fiscal year. Included in the total gifts for the fiscal year were those of the annual Campus Campaign, in which more than 2,380 faculty, staff and retirees contributed \$3,057,945 to support scholarships and programs across all three OU campuses.

The spring 2018 semester marked OU's 13th consecutive semester GPA above a 3.00. The 3.13 recorded by OU's student-athletes during the spring was the best single semester mark in recorded school history.

In November 2018, the university announced a \$34 million gift made to Harold Hamm Diabetes Center at OU Medicine. The gift was to be allocated over the next 10 years to fund research, talent and technology. The gift from The Harold Hamm Foundation was the largest gift ever made to the HHDC and follows the gift given by Hamm in 2007 that established the Harold Hamm Diabetes Center with the goal to cure diabetes.

The OU College of Public Health was officially named the Hudson College of Public Health in recognition of a \$5 million leadership gift from Dr. Leslie Hudson and Clifford Hudson.

In May 2018, the Stephenson Cancer Center received from the National Cancer Institute the highly-competitive status of "NCI Designation" and was awarded a P30 Cancer Center Support Grant. The Stephenson Cancer Center was one of only 69 (Top 2%) other cancer centers in the nation to be selected as a Designated Cancer Center by the NCI and the only one in the state of Oklahoma.

In recognition of major gifts from the Avenir Foundation and Professor Chun Lin, a former OU faculty member and current chair of the OU Department of Physics and Astronomy Board of Visitors, the university dedicated the Dodge Physics Complex and Lin Hall, a new academic building featuring more than 18,000 square feet of research laboratory space and an astronomy observatory on the roof.

The University of Oklahoma dedicated the Tom Love Innovation Hub at a ribbon-cutting ceremony held on the Research Campus.

Among the University of Oklahoma's most recognizable communal facilities as well as one of the state's most historic buildings, Holmberg Hall celebrated its 100th anniversary.

The University received one of the largest single gifts in OU history with a \$20 million investment to renovate OU ROTC program facilities, including the historic Armory, and to establish a scholarship endowment benefiting students enrolled in the Army, Navy or Air Force ROTC programs. A year-long celebration of the centennial of the Army Reserve Officers' Training Corp at OU culminated at the OU vs. Army football game.

OU celebrated the Geostationary Carbon Cycle Observatory project, known as GeoCarb, a science mission to space led by OU and funded by NASA. At \$161 million, it was the single-largest contract to be received in school history. The mission marked one of the most exceptional accomplishments in OU history.

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The University announced \$68 million in GEAR UP partnership awards to the K20 Center, with an additional \$68 million of matching funds for a total of \$137,006,776. With these awards, the K20 Center had an opportunity to make a significant impact on the quality of education in 46 schools and more than 12,000 students across Oklahoma, many of which have been deeply affected by issues such as poverty and teacher shortages.

Shortly before the end of the year, the University's goal to double research had already resulted in 742 grants for over \$174 million since July 1 – an increase of 98 grants for over \$15 million since November 1.

OU dedicated the James P. Pappas University Outreach Administration Building. The building was named in honor of James Pappas, former OU vice president for University Outreach, dean of the College of Liberal Studies and professor in the departments of Educational Psychology and Liberal Studies, who retired in January 2017 after almost 30 years of service to the university.

OU was named a top 50 best college for Latino students by Latino Leaders, a magazine dedicated to connecting and inspiring future leaders. The publication honors academic institutions that have excelled in serving the Latino student population.

The OU-TU School of Community Medicine, in partnership with the OU Hudson College of Public Health, launched an innovative initiative called culinary medicine in 2018. Future physicians and physician assistants are now learning how to integrate evidence-based nutrition and related lifestyle changes into patient treatment plans.

A total of 102 OU-TU School of Community Medicine students, as well as an additional 147 medical residents and faculty, participated in classes at the Tandy YMCA, where they received hands-on, healthy cooking instruction on how food can be used to prevent, treat and reverse chronic disease. A portion of these students went on to co-facilitate community cooking classes, which reached 182 individuals who are living with or who are at-risk for nutrition-related chronic disease.

In 2018 alone, the OU Center for Studies in Democracy and Culture hosted 14 community presentations and events, which were attended by a total of 850 faculty, staff, students and community members.

In March, a Stickwork sculpture designed by renowned artist Patrick Dougherty, was unveiled at the Chapman Green Park in downtown Tulsa at 6th and Main. Urban Design students helped Urban Core Art Project efforts to revitalize the space. Students coordinated community volunteers and helped build the piece. The sculpture is a semi-permanent art installation scheduled to be on display for the next couple of years.

The Early Childhood Education Institute received a \$2.7 million grant from the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development within the National Institute of Health to extend its SEED (School Experiences and Early Development), study in collaboration with researchers from Georgetown University.

In June 2018, the OU-TU School of Community Medicine's Physician Assistant Program celebrated its 10-year anniversary of welcoming the first class. Since the program began, a total of 213 physician assistants have been trained on the OU-Tulsa campus. For the past five years, there had been a 100 percent pass rate for the national certification exam, PANCE, for graduates. Further, since the program began all have gained employment as a physician assistant within three months of graduation.

The Oxley Foundation contributed \$6.5 million to establish the Mary Kay and John T. Oxley School of Community Medicine Scholarship Program. This generous gift provided scholarship support to medical and physician assistant students interested in entering general fields of medicine, such as family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics or psychiatry upon graduation.

The Sooners opened the 2018-19 academic year with 37 national championships and a continuing streak of producing at least one national title each year. Men's gymnastics led all teams with 12 national team titles. OU has won 287 conference titles since its first in 1915. Softball, women's gymnastics and men's gymnastics has won seven consecutive league titles, while football has won the Big 12 championship four consecutive seasons.

The 2017-18 academic year marked the 19th consecutive year for OU to produce at least one CoSIDA Academic All-American.

1890 to Present

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- 1890 On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
- 1891 First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
- 1892 David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president of the University of Oklahoma.
- On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.
- 1893 First college freshman enrolled.
- School of Pharmacy founded in response to demands for pharmacists in the territory.
- First annual catalog published; four departments were advertised: Preparatory, Collegiate, Pharmaceutical, and Musical.
- 1894 Oklahoma Historical Society organized.
- 1896 First degree -- that of Pharmaceutical Chemist -- conferred.
- 1897 The first OU newspaper, *The Umpire*, began operations.
- 1898 First Bachelor of Arts degree conferred.
- University created four new divisions: Graduate work, Premedical work, School of Music, and the Summer School.
- First graduate students enrolled.
- 1899 Alumni Association organized.
- Territorial legislature authorized creation of a department of Geology and Natural History, which later became the Geological Survey.
- First honorary degree conferred.
- 1900 First Master of Arts degree conferred.
- First medical instruction offered.
- 1901 Major elective system, with prescribed work in English, French, or German, biology or chemistry, and history was adopted by College of Arts and Sciences.
- 1902 School of Fine Arts established from School of Music.
- 1903 First Bachelor of Science degree conferred.
- Funds donated by Andrew Carnegie for the construction of a university library.
- 1904 School of Applied Science with curricula in mechanical, electrical, and civil engineering established.
- First Rhodes Scholar from OU chosen.
- 1905 Publication of the first OU yearbook, *The Mistletoe*, began.
- First social fraternity (Kappa Alpha) chartered.

- 1906 First Master of Science degree conferred.
- 1907 President Theodore Roosevelt issued proclamation admitting Oklahoma as the forty-sixth state of the Union. OU automatically became the state university.
- 1908 President Boyd dismissed. A. Grant Evans became second President of OU.
- 1909 University reorganized into the Graduate School, College of Arts and Sciences, School of Fine Arts, School of Pharmacy, College of Engineering, and School of Medicine.
School of Law organized.
Faculty Senate organized.
First sororities (Kappa Alpha Theta and Delta Delta Delta) chartered.
- 1910 School of Teaching organized in the College of Arts and Sciences.
Preparatory School discontinued.
School of Medicine merged with Epworth College of Medicine, with the first two years of School of Medicine continued on the Norman campus and the third and fourth years to be carried on at Oklahoma City.
- 1911 School of Nursing established.
First Doctor of Medicine degrees conferred.
President Evans resigned; Dean Julien Monnet of the Law School became Acting President.
The State Board of Education became governing board of the university.
- 1912 First law degrees conferred.
State University Hospital opened in Oklahoma City and operated a Training School for Nurses.
Stratton D. Brooks became President of OU.
- 1913 School of Journalism and School of Commerce and Industry organized in College of Arts and Sciences.
University Extension Division organized for distance learning.
- 1916 *The Oklahoma Daily*, first daily student newspaper, began operations.
- 1917 Student Loan Aid Association incorporated.
- 1919 School of Home Economics established in College of Arts and Sciences.
The Seventh Legislature repealed provision that made State Board of Education the Board of Regents and set up a new and separate Board of Regents for OU.
- 1920 Phi Beta Kappa chapter established at OU.
School of Education became independent school.
- 1922 Campus radio station (WNAD) went on the air.
- 1923 President Brooks resigned. Dean Buchanan of College of Arts and Sciences became Acting President, became President the following year.

- 1923 School of Business (formerly School of Commerce and Industry) organized as an independent school.
Oklahoma Geological Survey abolished.
- 1924 School of Fine Arts reorganized as College of Fine Arts with subordinate schools in painting and design, dramatic art, and music.
School of Petroleum Engineering established as part of College of Engineering.
Oklahoma Geological Survey re-established and placed under OU Board of Regents.
- 1925 William Bizzell became President of OU.
School of Physical Education established.
- 1926 Lew Wentz loan fund established.
- 1927 *Books Abroad*, international literary journal, published its first issue.
Oklahoma Biological Survey established.
Phillips Collection on Western History donated to the University Libraries.
School of Citizenship and Public Affairs and School of Geology organized in College of Arts and Sciences.
- 1928 First two years of School of Medicine transferred to Oklahoma City and the four-year curriculum was given on one campus.
Crippled Children's Hospital completed.
- 1929 First Doctor of Philosophy--in Zoology--conferred.
University of Oklahoma Press established.
School of Library Science established in College of Arts and Sciences.
Schools of Education and Business elevated to college status.
New University Library completed.
- 1931 First Doctor of Education degree conferred.
First visiting professor came to OU.
Appropriations for Geological Survey discontinued.
- 1932 School of General Engineering and School of Natural Gas Engineering organized in College of Engineering.
- 1935 AMA withdrew accreditation from Medical School, primarily because of political interference by governor admitting chiropractors to practice at University Hospital.
Oklahoma Geological Survey reopened.
- 1936 Museum of Art established.

OU has the academically highest ranked student body at a public university in Oklahoma history.

OU achieved an all-time record freshman-to-sophomore retention rate of 90 percent, ranking OU among the top universities in the nation.

OU is the only public university in Oklahoma to be included in the Fiske Guide to Colleges, which lists the top 10 percent of all U.S. universities.

OU has produced 29 Rhodes Scholars; no other university in Oklahoma has had more than three.

OU is the only university in the nation, public or private, whose students have won Goldwater, Mitchell, Truman, Rhodes, Marshall, Fulbright and National Security Education Program scholarships in the same year.

Hester Hall, home of the College of International Studies, was renamed as Farzaneh Hall and the Iranian Studies Program was renamed as Farzaneh Family Center for Iranian and Persian Gulf Studies.

OU was recently awarded the prestigious Davis Cup for the fourth consecutive year in recognition of its record-setting enrollment of United World College International freshmen. OU is the only public university to ever be awarded the Davis Cup.

For the first time in the history of OU College of Medicine in Tulsa, all four years of medical school were offered at the Schusterman Center through the OU-TU School of Community Medicine.

- 2017 In January, David Boren began his 50th year of public service, as governor of Oklahoma, U.S. Senator, member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and as OU president. In September, Boren announced plans to retire as president, effective June 30, 2018.

For the second year in a row, OU set an all-time record in freshman-to-sophomore retention. Of first-year students entering OU in Fall 2016, 92.1 percent returned for their sophomore year in fall 2018.

OU was ranked among the top institutions in the nation, both public and private, for its online degree programs, according to U.S. News & World Report.

For the second year in a row, OU was a recipient of the 2017 Higher Education Excellence in Diversity Award, the only national award honoring individual colleges or universities for their outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion across their campuses

OU's first Residential Colleges, Dunham College and Headington College, were dedicated. Patterned after those at Harvard, Yale, Oxford and Cambridge, OU was the first university in the state and one of the first public universities in the nation to adopt the residential college model.

Bizzell Memorial Library, built in 1929, was named among 18 stunning university libraries around the world, according to Architectural Digest. OU was the only Big 12 University to be recognized.

The museum program recognized for the award is the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair, a program that for 15 years has reached thousands of young Native Americans across Oklahoma and the Southwest.

The University of Oklahoma was 2017's Big 12 Conference Champion of the College and University Green Power Challenge for using more green power than any other school in the conference, according to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency rankings.

The College of Liberal Studies was renamed the College of Professional and Continuing Studies.

The OU-Tulsa Office of Community Engagement was established.

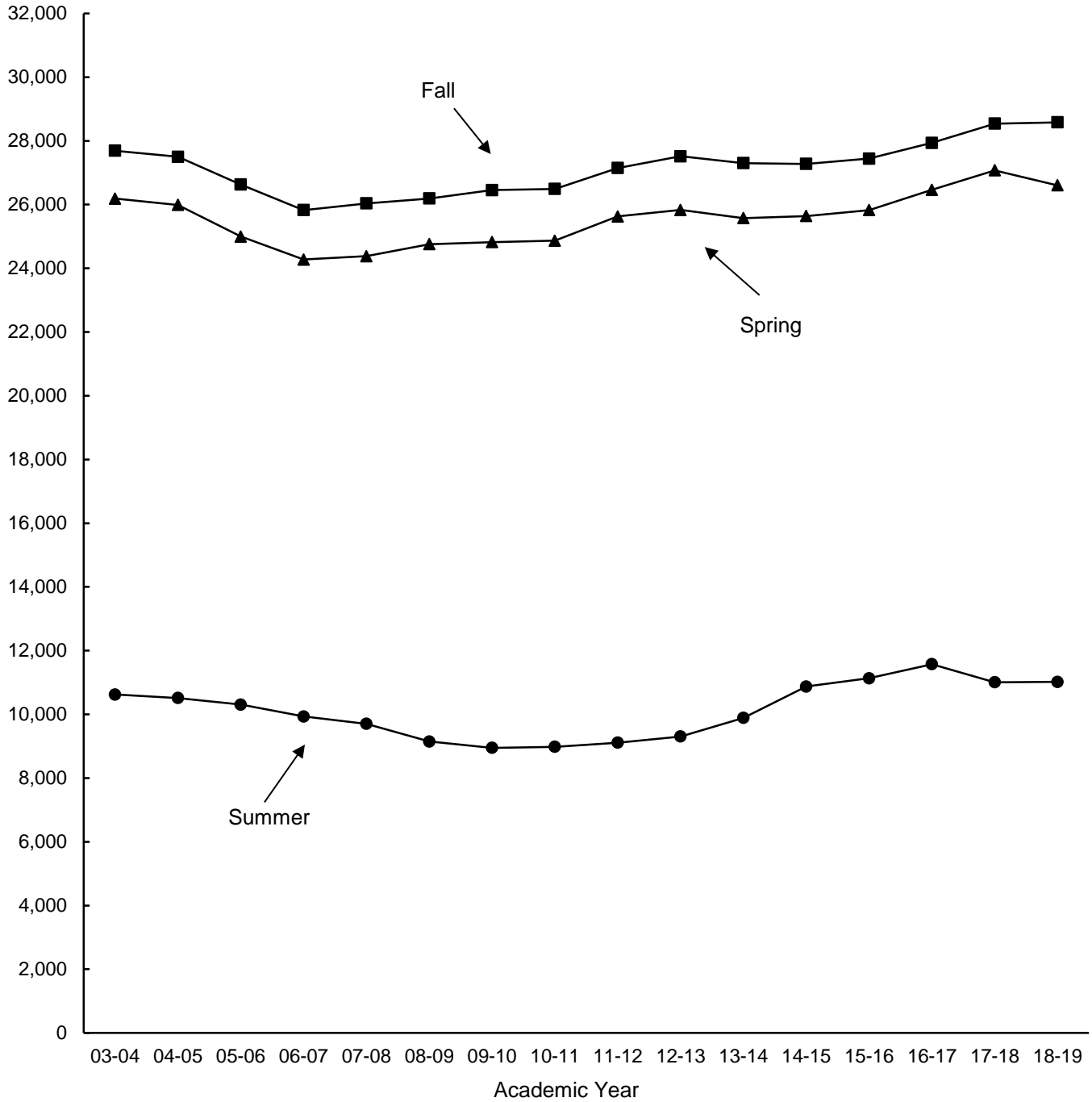

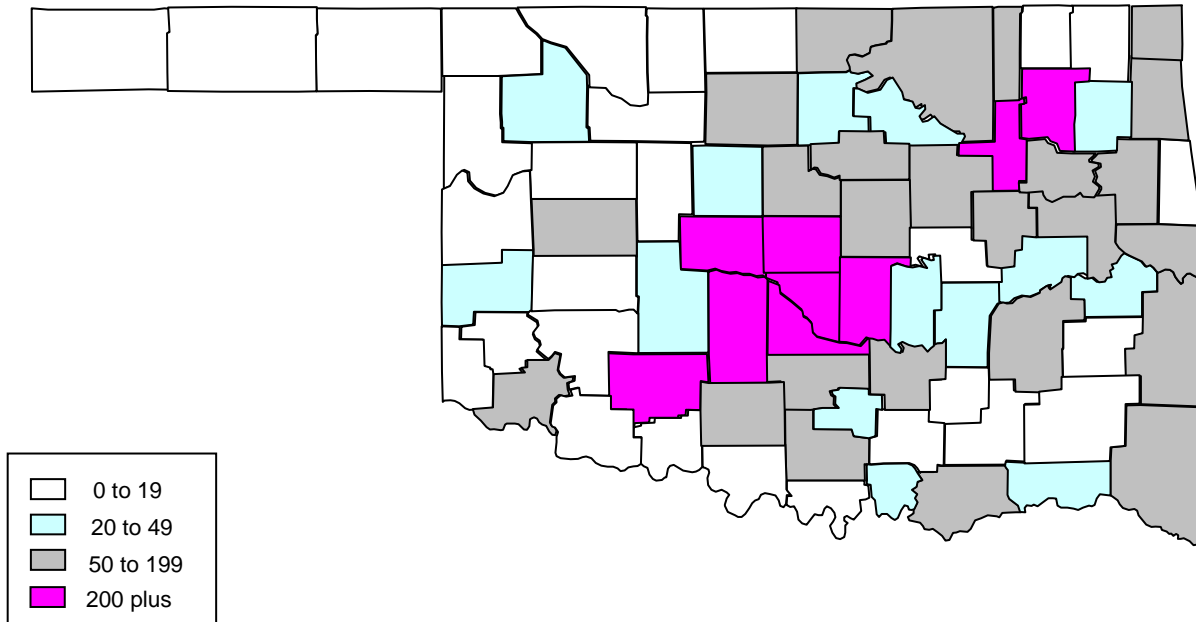

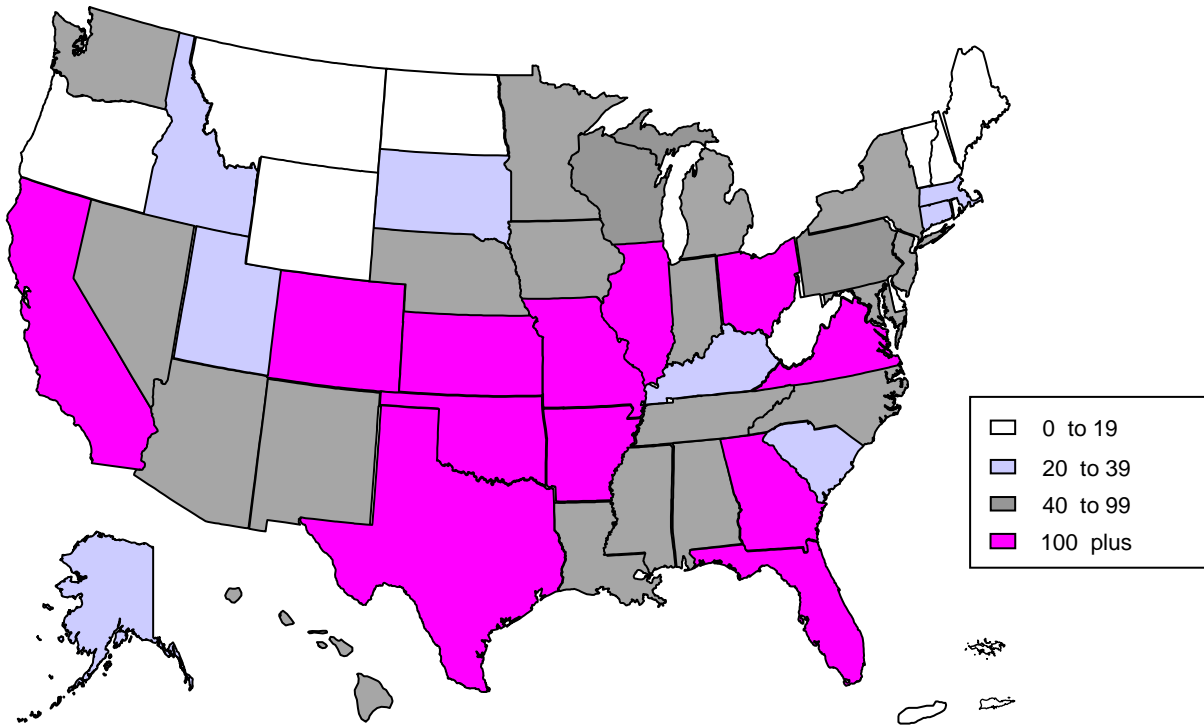

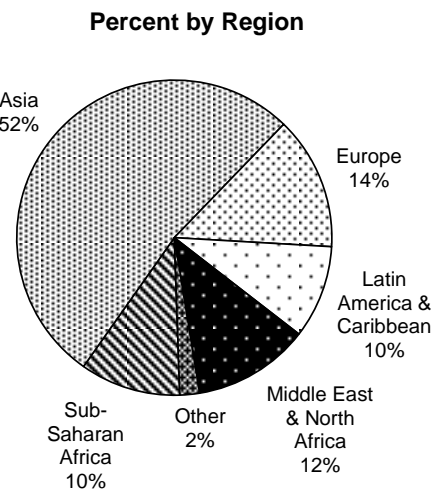

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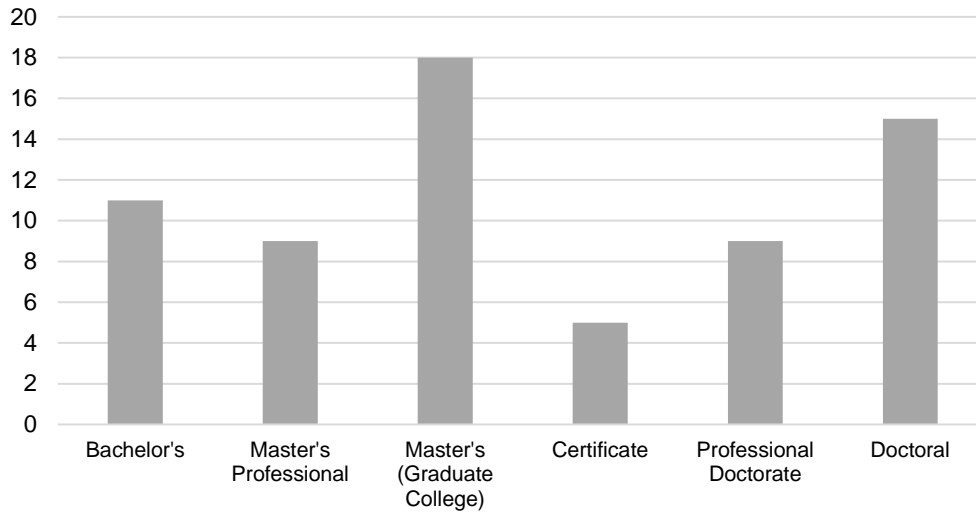
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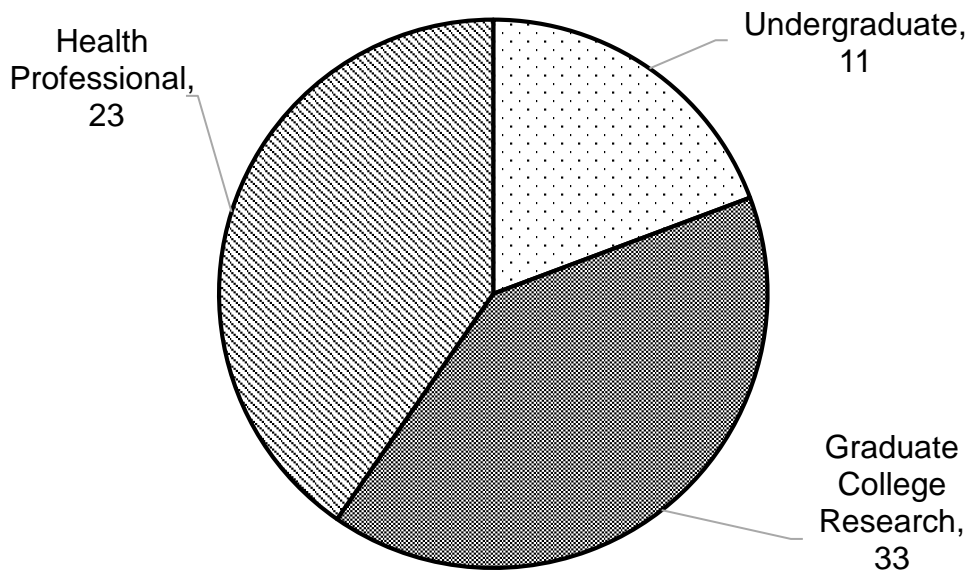

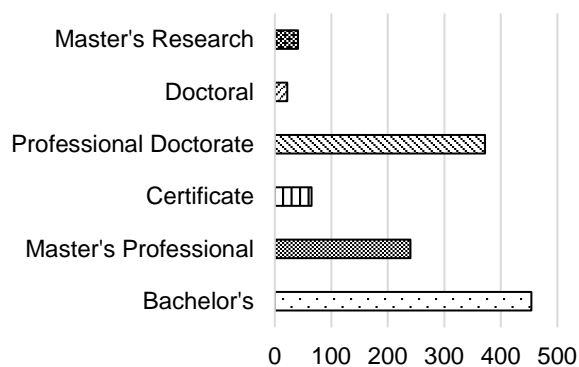

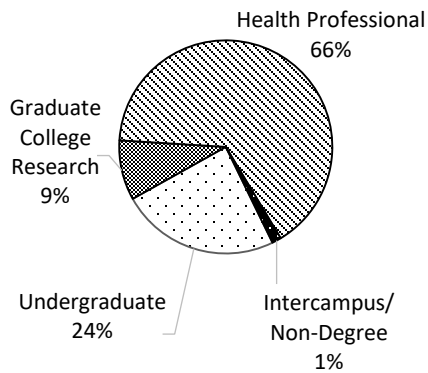

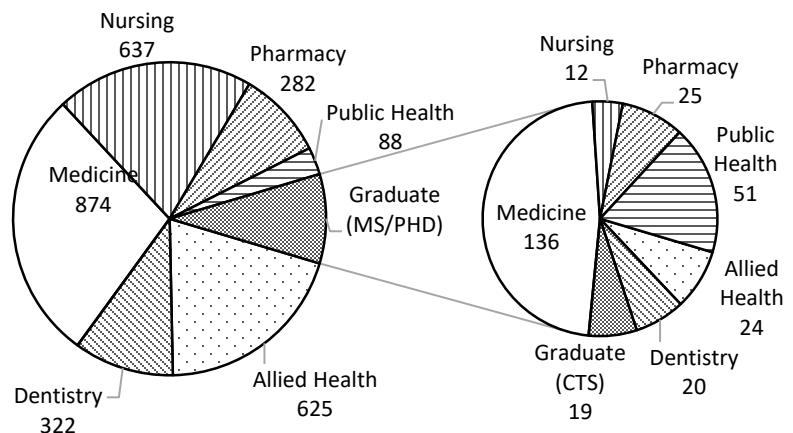

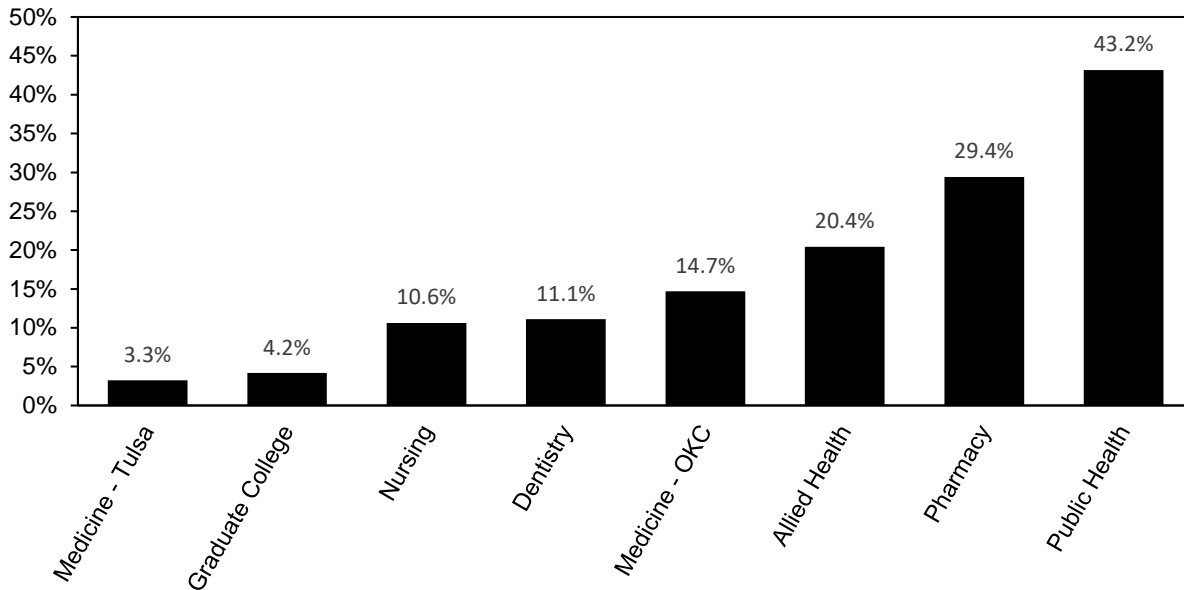

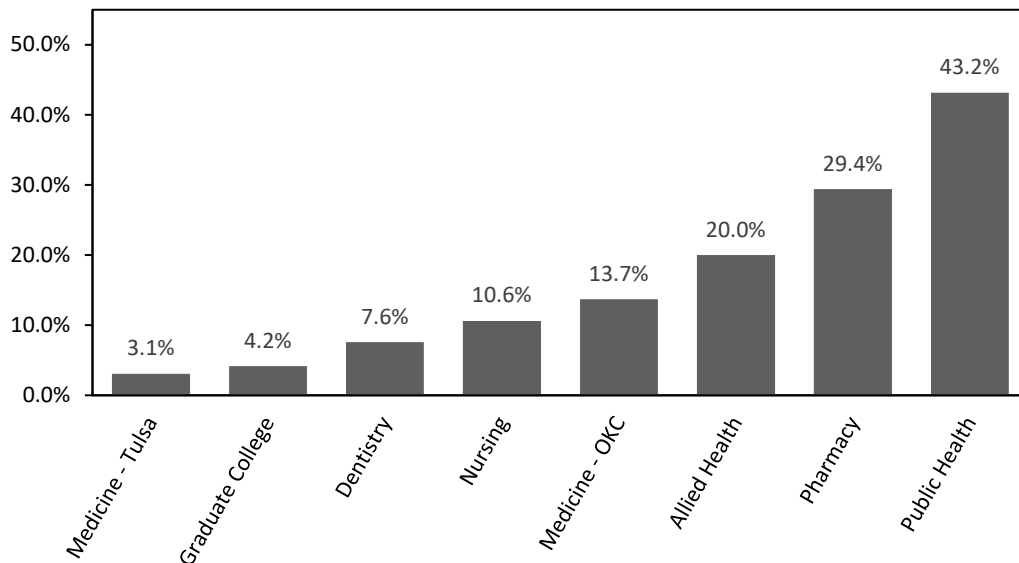

OU Extended Campus is best characterized by the populations it serves, as well as the specialized academic programming it offers. Primarily focusing on the higher education needs of place-bound working adults, military-connected personnel, and those seeking specialized study in selected professional areas (such as Aviation), the College offers a variety of degrees at both graduate and undergraduate levels, including several programs offered collaboratively with other OU Colleges, and utilizing a variety of delivery modes (fully online, hybrid, onsite, cohort-based, etc.).
