

#### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

#### UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

The university is a part of the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, which is composed of all higher education institutions supported wholly or in part by state appropriations. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education is the coordinating board for the system.

The university – as part of the public educational system of the state, established by legislative action and supported by annual legislative appropriations – places emphasis on sound scholarship, good citizenship, and the duties of the individual to the community and the commonwealth.

By constitutional enactment, the governance of the university is vested in the OU Board of Regents, a board consisting of seven members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the State Senate. Each member is appointed to serve for seven years, except when appointed to fill an unexpired term, and is subject to removal from office only as provided by law for the removal of officers not liable to impeachment.

The Oklahoma State Regents and the university regents approve the requirements for admission and graduation, the degrees offered, and the fees and expenses. The boards reserve the right to change these requirements.

#### **NORMAN CAMPUS**

The central campus and the offices of administration of the University of Oklahoma are located on some 3,500 acres in Norman, a city of more than 100,000 residents. Norman is located near the center of the state, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City, the state capital.

The colleges housed on the Norman campus are University College, the Christopher C. Gibbs College of Architecture, the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, the Michael F. Price College of Business, the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the Gallogly College of Engineering, the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts, the Graduate College, the Joe C. and Carole Kerr McClendon Honors College, the David L. Boren College of International Studies, the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, the College of Law, and the College of Professional and Continuing Studies - OU Extended Campus. The Norman campus is also headquarters for the College of Continuing Education, which directs outreach programs throughout the state.

The Norman campus consists of four sections – central campus, south campus, research campus and north campus. Most of the academic and administrative buildings are located on the central campus, noted for its Cherokee Gothic architecture and award-winning landscaping. Also situated on the central campus are the university residence halls, which include residential colleges and other upperclassman housing; Sarkeys Energy Center; University Libraries; Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art; Donald W. Reynolds Performing Arts Center, including historic Holmberg Hall; Rupel Jones Fine Arts Center, including Elsie C. Brackett Theatre; Catlett Music Center, including Sharp Concert Hall and Pitman Recital Hall; Oklahoma Memorial Union; recreational facilities, including the Sarkeys Fitness Center and the Murray Case Sells Swim Complex; Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium; the Everest Indoor Training Center; and the Oklahoma Center for Continuing Education, a year-round educational center and conference site. Located one block east of the central campus is the OU Brandt Park and Duck Pond, a recreational area used throughout the year by OU students and Norman residents. David A. Burr Park is conveniently located near residence halls and other recreational facilities.

The first of its kind in the state, the OU Visitor Center serves all guests of the University of Oklahoma as a one-stop information and welcome center. This "front door" of the university is housed in historic Jacobson Faculty Hall and provides regular, guided tours for prospective students and advanced-scheduled group tours. Free parking passes for campus visitors are available at the Visitor Center. An extensive collection of photographs and art depicting the history and heritage of the university fills the Visitor Center. It also has been designated as a local Tourism Information Center by the Oklahoma Tourism & Recreation Department to provide state travel information. #### South Campus

Immediately adjacent to central campus is the south campus, site of the College of Law; the OU Foundation; OU Traditions apartments; the world-class Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History; Lloyd Noble Center and parking complex; the John Crain Field at the OU Soccer Complex; the Headington Family Tennis Center; the Gregg Wadley Tennis Pavilion; the Jimmie Austin University of Oklahoma Golf Course; L. Dale Mitchell Baseball Park; the Marita Hynes Field – OU Women's Softball Complex; the Sam Viersen Gymnastics Center; the OU Rugby Field; the OU Rowing Training Center; and the OU Learning Center.

#### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA CAMPUSES

#### **Research Campus**

In less than a decade, the 277-acre OU Research Campus has been transformed from an empty field to a thriving economic engine shaped by a community of public and private sector collaborations located in nearly 1 million square feet of occupied space representing \$300 million in investment. Today, the Research Campus brings together 1,700 workers across academic, federal, state and industrial organizations in a mutually beneficial environment.

The National Weather Center, a 257,000 square-foot facility that opened in 2006, anchors the OU Research Campus on the south. The Center houses both academic and federal groups dedicated to forecasting, research and training. The Stephenson Research and Technology Center and the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center house cutting-edge research in fields including robotics, genomics, bioengineering and the OU Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, which includes a National Institutes of Health-funded structural biology program. A series of five "Partners Place" buildings, totaling 362,000 square-feet, enable the public and private sector collaboration on weather and radar research; innovation and entrepreneurship; and water, climate, and energy. The OU Innovation Hub serves as a creative space for students and faculty in support of invention and entrepreneurship. Additionally, a 35,000 square-foot "one of a kind" Radar Innovations Laboratory opened in 2015.

OU's Research Campus has been certified by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as Site Ready, which allows the university to capitalize on fast-moving economic opportunities and enables site selectors to readily find quality land and facilities that meet nationally established criteria. OU's Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks, placing it among such past recipients as Research Triangle Park in North Carolina, Purdue Research Park in Indiana and University City Science Center in Pennsylvania.

#### **North Campus**

North campus, which is two miles north of the main campus, includes the Merrick Computer Center; Max Westheimer Airport, the University-operated airport that also serves the City of Norman; and Swearingen Research Park, where government agencies and industry have established facilities.

Other research and study units of the university include the Biological Station on Lake Texoma; the Sutton Avian Research Center in Bartlesville; the Oklahoma Geophysical Observatory at Leonard near Tulsa; the Aquatic Biology Fisheries Research Center in Noble near Norman; and the Oklahoma Biological Survey, the Oklahoma Archeological Survey and Charles M. Russell Center for the Study of Art of the American West in Norman. In addition, the Oklahoma Geological Survey is a state agency mandated in the Constitution of Oklahoma, and is part of the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy at the University of Oklahoma.

#### **HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER**

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center (OUHSC) is one of the most comprehensive academic health centers in the nation, with programs in Oklahoma City, Tulsa, and Lawton; six professional Colleges and the Graduate College; research centers of excellence such as the Stephenson Cancer Center, Harold Hamm Diabetes Center, and Dean McGee Eye Institute; and the state's largest clinical group practice OU Physicians with over 1,200 credentialed providers. Students enroll in programs at the College of Allied Health, College of Dentistry, College of Medicine and School of Community Medicine, Fran and Earl Ziegler College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, Hudson College of Public Health, and Graduate College.

The OUHSC prepares healthcare professionals and scientists to meet tomorrow's most complex healthcare needs, through research, discovery, and interdisciplinary education experiences. The OUHSC is a premier healthcare training institution for over 3,300 students, 80 post-doctoral researchers, and 800 residents and fellows, graduating physicians, biomedical and clinician scientists, nurses, dentists, pharmacists, allied health professionals, and public health leaders. Prominent OUHSC researchers receive the largest portfolio of National Institutes of Health (NIH) funding in the state, and commercialize new treatments and diagnostic tests, utilizing state-of-the-art research facilities such as the University Research Park, Stanton L. Young Biomedical Research Center, and Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation (OMRF). The Stephenson Cancer Center is the only National Cancer Institute (NCI) designated Center in Oklahoma and in the top 2 percent nationwide.

The OUHSC is a founding partner with the University Hospitals Authority and Trust of the academic health system OU Medicine, which includes OU Medical Center, The Children's Hospital, and OU Medical Center Edmond. The OUHSC and OU Medicine combine efforts as the only research-driven healthcare system in Oklahoma, with treatment options and expertise found nowhere else. The Tulsa campus is part of the OU Medicine statewide

system partnership, and also has academic and clinical affiliations with the Hillcrest, St. Francis, and St. John health systems. OUHSC has additional affiliations with the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Oklahoma City, and other hospitals, clinics, health departments, and healthcare facilities across Oklahoma.

Scientists, scholars and clinicians at the OUHSC deliver healthcare solutions through bench-to-bedside-to-community research and through training the state's most comprehensive and skilled health workforce. The OUHSC is an essential partner for the state to improve health outcomes and drive economic growth and diversification.

#### **OU-TULSA SCHUSTERMAN CENTER**

The OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center is located in the heart of mid-town Tulsa at 41st and Yale. On this campus both the OU Health Sciences Center and the OU Norman Campus offer programs. The vision of OU-Tulsa is to build a nationally-recognized center of higher education excellence in select areas that emphasize strong campus-community partnerships and leverage unique opportunities and needs in the Tulsa region.

OU has a long history in the Tulsa area. The earliest program of the University of Oklahoma in Tulsa started in 1957 as a partnership with the Tulsa City-County Library. This program averaged 50 students a year and was one of the first programs to be part of the Tulsa Graduate Center, which became University Center at Tulsa in 1982. Recognizing the potential community impact of an expansion of OU services in Tulsa, the Oklahoma Legislature enacted Senate Bill 453 in 1972 that created a clinical branch of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. Today, the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa enrolls medical students and trains 181 residents who conduct 200,000 patient visits annually at the college's ambulatory clinics.

Although OU's presence in Tulsa has been longstanding, it changed dramatically in 1999. As a result of the transformational \$10 million gift from the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation and the leadership of President David L. Boren, OU was able to purchase 60 acres at the corner of 41st and Yale, previously the BP-Amoco Research Center. The OU programs in Tulsa had been located in a wide variety of physical locations. By the fall of 2002, all OU academic programs in Tulsa were located at the Schusterman Center campus. This campus has allowed OU to better serve the community by providing a strong, centralized identity in Tulsa.

In February of 2008, the George Kaiser Family Foundation made a \$50 million gift to the OU College of Medicine in Tulsa allowing the College of Medicine to have the explicit focus to improve the health status of underserved communities. To reflect that change, the name of the College of Medicine in Tulsa was changed to the OU School of Community Medicine, the first in the nation. The School of Community Medicine remains an integral part of the OU College of Medicine. The University of Tulsa and the University of Oklahoma welcomed its first class of students to the School of Community Medicine four-year educational track in Tulsa in 2015. The Tandy Education Center also opened in 2015 and is a space that provides students the opportunity to practice lifelike circumstances using models and virtual reality. It is a state-of-the-art facility that features the latest advances in medical simulation.

#### **OU EXTENDED CAMPUS - COLLEGE OF PROFESSIONAL AND CONTINUING STUDIES**

OU Extended Campus - College of Professional and Continuing Studies (EC-PACS) exists to provide access to transformational, world-class University of Oklahoma degrees, certifications, and programs for a diverse group of learners. OU Extended Campus is best characterized by the populations it serves, as well as the specialized academic programming it offers. Primarily focusing on the higher education needs of place-bound working adults, military-connected personnel, and those seeking specialized study in selected professional areas (such as Aviation), the College offers a variety of degrees at both graduate and undergraduate levels, including several programs offered collaboratively with other OU Colleges, and utilizing a variety of delivery modes (fully online, hybrid, onsite, cohort-based, etc.). To facilitate understanding of the complex world in which we live and building on its historical roots, the College emphasizes a holistic approach to learning, focuses on the immediate application of learning to one's life and work, promotes lifelong learning opportunities, and encourages the work of active citizenship.

While its programs were originally developed for adult and non-traditional students, many of the activities offered by the College also serve students enrolled in conventional academic programs, as well as the general public. Therefore, in addition to the full-time degree program offerings noted above, EC-PACS is also committed to meeting the educational needs of a wide variety of learners and organizations seeking smaller scale academic options, including credit courses, workshops, academic conferences, certification programs, executive academic programs and academically-oriented professional training services.

In May, the OU Board of Regents unanimously voted to name Joseph Harroz Jr. the university's 15th president. As an OU alumnus, Harroz has served his alma mater in various leadership roles for nearly 25 years, serving most recently as the university's interim president and as dean of the OU College of Law.

In July, the OU Board of Regents approved OU's first Strategic Plan in over a generation, which defined a clear plan for the university's future and comprehensive strategies to achieve it. "Lead On, University" – OU's Strategic Plan for the Norman campus – draws upon 130 years of history and the feedback of thousands of students, faculty, staff and alumni to establish a path toward long-term success.

The OU community responded to the COVID-19 pandemic with creativity, kindness and determination. When it became necessary to suddenly shift classes online in the middle of the spring 2020 semester, the university did not miss a single day of instruction. Throughout the summer, staff and faculty worked tirelessly to welcome back students and resume in-person classes for the fall semester in the healthiest possible campus environment. A number of comprehensive health and safety measures were introduced, including the appointment of a Chief COVID Officer to guide OU's decision-making and planning; requiring face masks; modifying class schedules and learning spaces to accommodate social distancing; and much more. OU also launched a number of proactive strategies to mitigate the spread of the virus on campus, including a COVID-19 testing program for residential students. An online dashboard provided regular updates related to the public health situation on campus and within the surrounding community.

OU's Class of 2024 was one of its most diverse freshman classes in its 130-year history, with over 35% of students identifying as minorities. The class included 4,422 freshmen – the third-largest class in OU history. Nearly a quarter of the students in the entering class were first-generation college students.

OU announced the launch of OU Online, a central division that delivers the university's online graduate degree programs, expanding OU's ability to reach students in Oklahoma and beyond. Designed for adult learners seeking career advancement, OU Online's programs offer specialized graduate degree in a variety of professional fields.

OU transitioned to a test-optional admissions process, making OU the first public university in the state to adopt a multiyear, test-optional undergraduate admissions policy. The university was authorized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to implement the new policy through the 2025 admissions cycle.

For the first time in its 130-year history, OU held virtual graduation ceremonies in May and December to celebrate the Class of 2020. The changes were necessitated by the COVID-19 pandemic and marked the end of a unique academic experience for graduates, who were invited to participate in OU's inperson graduation ceremonies planned for May 2021.

The OU Health Sciences Center and OU Medicine announced the launch of OU Health – a new, unified brand identity for the combined clinical enterprises of OUHSC and OU's hospital partner. The OU Health brand captures over a century of providing unmatched patient care, advancing scientific discovery and training Oklahoma's health care workforce – all marked by our distinction as the state's only comprehensive academic health system.

OU was selected by The Princeton Review as one of "The Best 386 Colleges," "Best Value College for 2020," "Best Western School" and "Top Green College." OU was also named the No. 5 school in the nation with the happiest students.

For the seventh time in the past eight years, OU was awarded the Davis Cup in recognition of its record-setting enrollment of Davis United World College international freshmen, with an all-time high of 76 Davis UWC Scholars in the OU Class of 2024. OU also boasted the largest total enrollment of Davis United World College Scholars in the United States, with 265 UWC Scholars representing 97 countries.

Seven OU students and alumni were named Fulbright grant recipients for the 2020-21 academic year. Since 1949, there had been 122 Fulbright Scholars at OU, traveling to 41 countries.

Three OU honors students were named 2020 Goldwater Scholars, bringing OU's total number of Goldwater Scholarship winners to 58 since the inception of the scholarship in 1986.

For the fourth consecutive year, *U.S. News & World Report* ranked OU's online bachelor's degree program as one of the top 10 in the country out of more than 350 universities nationwide. In the *U.S. News & World Report* 2021 Best Colleges rankings, OU placed at No. 133 among the best national universities overall and No. 62 among national public institutions.

Out of more than 200 law schools, the OU College of Law was ranked fifth in the nation as a "Best Value" law school, according to *National Jurist* magazine.

The Fran and Earl Ziegler College of Nursing was ranked 56th out of more than 3,000 nursing schools nationwide in *Nursing Schools Almanac*'s 2019 rankings of the best nursing schools in the United States -- placing the OU College of Nursing in the sixth spot overall in the Southwest region.

The research landscape at OU has progressed tremendously in the past year, with researchers on the Norman campus setting a record-high \$255.6 million in research awards earned through grants and external funding in FY2020, surpassing the previous benchmark of \$218 million for the FY2019. This trajectory continues, with research awards up 7% at the end of the first quarter of FY2021. In addition, OUHSC earned a record-high \$190 million in federal and state awards during FY2020, and three departments in the OU College of Medicine were ranked among the top 20 in the nation for funding from the National Institutes of Health.

The largest contribution to the record total of research awards in FY2020 was due to continuing investment by NASA in the Geostationary Carbon Cycle Observatory. Set to launch in 2023, the GeoCarb satellite observatory will study how and why the global carbon cycle is changing and also will monitor plant health and vegetation stress throughout the Americas. The project was funded through June, 2026.

OU is leading a National Science Foundation AI Institute for Research on Trustworthy AI in Weather, Climate, and Coastal Oceanography that is being hailed as a "historic milestone in environmental science." NSF recently announced an investment of more than \$100 million to establish five AI Institutes to support research and education hubs nationwide. An OU faculty member will lead this institute, which received \$20 million of the NSF funding.

OU entered an agreement to develop a joint research program with the Universidad Nacional de San Agustín, one of Peru's largest and oldest public research universities. UNSA is sponsoring research collaborations to study global grand challenges including COVID-19, cancer therapy, public health monitoring and climate impacts.

OU received more than \$115.5 million in private cash gifts during the 2020 fiscal year, which included contributions from 1,382 corporations, 535 foundations and more than 26,300 alumni and friends of the university. Of those giving in FY2020, 6,011 were first-time donors.

The OU Health Sciences Center was awarded a five-year, \$38 million grant to lead and expand a national program dedicated to suicide prevention.

The Seed Sower Society, a distinguished group of donors whose cumulative gifts to the university total \$1 million or more, inducted new members, bringing the total number of individuals, corporations and foundations honored by the society to 580.

OU completed renovations to the historic Armory after receiving one of the largest single gifts in university history – a \$20 million investment from the Mulva Family Foundation – to renovate OU ROTC program facilities and establish a scholarship endowment benefiting students enrolled in the Army, Navy or Air Force ROTC programs.

During the 2019-2020 academic year, more than \$31 million was awarded to students, including student-athletes, on all three campuses from privately funded scholarships.

A \$4.8 million gift from the Horizon Foundation of Dallas helped to establish OU as the premier center for Native American research and teaching. The gift to the OU Foundation formally launched the OU Native Peoples Initiative, which places the cultures of Native peoples and the sovereignty of Native Nations at the center of academic study across all three OU campuses.

In December, an anonymous \$2 million gift to OU's Fran and Earl Ziegler College of Nursing paved the way to expand the previously funded Forni Clinic, adding an acute care simulation center, a state-of-the-art clinical assessment lab and a universal-design apartment home to support nursing education at all levels. The budget also includes an endowment to sustain the learning space in perpetuity.

A \$7.5 million leadership gift was pledged in November from Jim and Christy Everest and the E.L. and Thelma Gaylord Foundation. The funds endow a world-class chief of pediatric hematology/oncology at the Oklahoma Children's Hospital Jimmy Everest Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders in Children in partnership with OU Health Stephenson Cancer Center. This funding established an endowed chair in the OU College of Medicine for the new leader of the Jimmy Everest Center and will be instrumental in the recruitment of five to eight additional researchers and faculty members.

The Sooners entered the 2021 calendar year with 38 national championships in athletics and had produced at least one NCAA team champion in seven of the past eight years (none during the 2020 calendar year; most winter and spring 2020 NCAA national championship events were canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic), with the last title produced by women's gymnastics in spring 2019. Men's gymnastics led all OU sports programs with 12 national team titles.

OU had won 292 conference titles since its first in 1915. Softball, women's gymnastics and men's gymnastics had won eight consecutive league titles (2012-19), while football had won the Big 12 championship each of the past six seasons (2015-20).

The spring 2020 semester marked OU's 17th consecutive semester with a cumulative student-athlete GPA above a 3.00. The cumulative 3.17 recorded by OU's student-athletes during the 2020 spring semester was the highest single-semester mark in recorded school history.

- On December 19, Territorial Governor Steele approved bills for the location of three territorial schools: the university at Norman, the agricultural and mechanical school at Stillwater, and a normal school at Edmond.
- 1891 First Board of Regents for the University of Oklahoma appointed by Governor Steele.
- 1892 David Ross Boyd, Superintendent of the Arkansas City, Kansas school system, became first president of the University of Oklahoma.

On September 15, OU enrolled the first students. Of the 57 students who presented themselves for admission, not one qualified for freshman standing. Therefore, the university began its career as a preparatory school and continued as such for several years.

1893 First college freshman enrolled.

School of Pharmacy founded in response to demands for pharmacists in the territory.

First annual catalog published; four departments were advertised: Preparatory, Collegiate, Pharmaceutical, and Musical.

- 1894 Oklahoma Historical Society organized.
- 1896 First degree -- that of Pharmaceutical Chemist -- conferred.
- The first OU newspaper, *The Umpire*, began operations.
- 1898 First Bachelor of Arts degree conferred.

University created four new divisions: Graduate work, Premedical work, School of Music, and the Summer School.

First graduate students enrolled.

1899 Alumni Association organized.

Territorial legislature authorized creation of a department of Geology and Natural History, which later became the Geological Survey.

First honorary degree conferred.

1900 First Master of Arts degree conferred.

First medical instruction offered.

- 1901 Major elective system, with prescribed work in English, French, or German, biology or chemistry, and history was adopted by College of Arts and Sciences.
- 1902 School of Fine Arts established from School of Music.
- 1903 First Bachelor of Science degree conferred.

Funds donated by Andrew Carnegie for the construction of a university library.

1904 School of Applied Science with curricula in mechanical, electrical, and civil engineering established.

First Rhodes Scholar from OU chosen.

1905 Publication of the first OU yearbook, *The Mistletoe*, began.

First social fraternity (Kappa Alpha) chartered.

1906 First Master of Science degree conferred.

- 1907 President Theodore Roosevelt issued proclamation admitting Oklahoma as the forty-sixth state of the Union. OU automatically became the state university.
- 1908 President Boyd dismissed. A. Grant Evans became second President of OU.
- 1909 University reorganized into the Graduate School, College of Arts and Sciences, School of Fine Arts, School of Pharmacy, College of Engineering, and School of Medicine.

School of Law organized.

Faculty Senate organized.

First sororities (Kappa Alpha Theta and Delta Delta Delta) chartered.

1910 School of Teaching organized in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Preparatory School discontinued.

School of Medicine merged with Epworth College of Medicine, with the first two years of School of Medicine continued on the Norman campus and the third and fourth years to be carried on at Oklahoma City.

1911 School of Nursing established.

First Doctor of Medicine degrees conferred.

President Evans resigned; Dean Julien Monnet of the Law School became Acting President.

The State Board of Education became governing board of the university.

The new Dermatology Surgery Center opened at OU Physicians Dermatology in Oklahoma City.

2004 The Honors College building was named the David L. Boren Hall.

The Health Sciences Center student center was named the David L. Boren Student Union.

The ballroom in Oklahoma Memorial Union was named the Molly Shi Boren Ballroom.

The OU College of Fine Arts was named the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts.

Gaylord Hall, a state-of-the-art media education facility, was dedicated.

The Edith Kinney Gaylord Expository Writing Program was launched.

The OU Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art received half of the R. E. Mansfield Native American Art Collection.

The university celebrated the reopening of a newly remodeled Huston Huffman Physical Fitness Center, voted for and paid for by student funds.

OU opened One Partners Place, a space designated to foster collaborations with private companies on the Research Campus. Weathernews Inc. is the first tenant.

The Mary and Howard Lester Wing of the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art was dedicated. The museum received the Tate Collection and 11 works of art bequeathed by the late Jerome M. Westheimer.

2005 The Donald W. Reynolds Performing Arts Center was dedicated in April.

The Michael F. Price Hall for the Price College of Business was dedicated in September.

The College of Earth and Energy was formed from the Mewbourne School of Petroleum and Geological Engineering, School of Geology and Geophysics, Sarkeys Energy Center institutes and programs and the Oklahoma Geological Survey.

The College of Geosciences was renamed the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences, with the School of Meteorology and Department of Geography and their related units.

The Oklahoma Climatological Survey celebrated 25 years of service to Oklahomans.

2006 The School of Accounting was named the John T. Steed School of Accounting.

In FY 2006, 26 new endowed positions were added bringing the total endowed positions to 406.

OU received an academic excellence grant from the OU Foundation for \$2.7 million, with the grant to be recurring each year.

Dr. Gerry Clancy, dean of the OU College of Medicine, Tulsa, was named OU-Tulsa president.

The University of Pennsylvania donated a historically important M.P. Möller pipe organ (Op. 5819) to the newly organized American Organ Institute at OU.

University-wide Research Cabinet was created to coordinate research planning on all three OU campuses.

The National Weather Center – a unique partnership of OU and the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Norman-based weather research and operations programs – opened.

OU was named a Confucius Institute site.

The Department of Emergency Medicine was established at OU-Tulsa.

The Chickasaw and Choctaw nations committed funds for the creation of endowed faculty positions in OU diabetes research and clinical care programs.

The number of endowed faculty positions increased to 445 in FY 2007.

The Schusterman Clinic opened at the OU-Tulsa Schusterman Center.

A new research program focusing on the diseases of aging was established.

The new Oklahoma Diabetes Center at the OU Health Sciences Center was named for Harold Hamm.

OU's Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art and the Philbrook Museum of Art in Tulsa were jointly selected to receive the Eugene B. Adkins collection of Taos and Native American art.

The College of Earth and Energy was renamed the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy.

OU purchased a mobile clinic unit, Sooner Schooner II, for use by the OU College of Medicine, Tulsa.

OU added women's rowing to its intercollegiate athletics program.

2008 The total number of OU faculty endowments increased to 539.

Responding to the 2007 ice storm that destroyed or damaged more than 1,000 trees on OU's campuses, members of the OU family responded with a \$1.7 million Reforestation Campaign.

The George Kaiser Family Foundation announced a \$50 million gift, and the College of Medicine at OU-Tulsa changed its focus and became the first formally named School of Community Medicine of the nation.

2008 The College of Education was named for Jeannine Rainbolt, a 1951 education alumna, making the college the first in OU's history to be named for a woman.

The Schusterman Learning Center, the first building at the Schusterman Center designed solely for student classrooms, study and social space, was dedicated.

University Libraries added its 5 millionth volume, keeping it the state's largest research library.

2009 OU dedicated the renovated Old Science Hall, which is named for alumna Beatrice Carr Wallace.

Lissa and Cy Wagner Hall, a one-stop shop for student academic services, opened.

The Women's Studies Program in the College of Arts and Sciences was renamed the Women's and Gender Studies Program.

A new state-of-the-art facility for the College of Allied Health was dedicated.

Phase II of Gaylord Hall, home of the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication, was dedicated.

The School of Social Work was renamed Anne and Henry Zarrow School of Social Work.

2010 The total number of OU faculty endowments increased to over 560.

OU achieved the Carnegie Foundation basic classification's highest tier of research activity, the first time a public institution in Oklahoma had achieved such recognition.

OU established an Institute for Water and Sustainability.

The Department of Geography in the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences was renamed the Department of Geography and Environmental Sustainability.

OU's Norman campus faculty achieved a record in FY 2010 grant funding, topping \$100 million for the first time in the university's history.

The Division of Construction Science was renamed the Haskell and Irene Lemon Construction Science Division.

Devon Energy Hall and the ExxonMobil Lawrence G. Rawl Engineering Practice Facility, both state-of-the-art facilities for the College of Engineering, were dedicated.

OU established the John B. Turner Master of Laws (LL.M.) Program in the OU College of Law.

The newly renovated and expanded Collings Hall for the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education was dedicated.

OU received the Bialac Collection of more than 3,500 works representing indigenous cultures across North America, one of the most important private collections of Native American art in the country.

OU joined forces with ConocoPhillips to create a new Biocorrosion Center with the OU Institute of Energy and the Environment.

2011 The College of International Studies was established.

The Film and Video Studies program in the College of Arts and Sciences was renamed Film and Media Studies.

Dedication ceremonies were held for the Peggy and Charles Stephenson Cancer Center.

The Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center, housing the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, was dedicated.

Dedication ceremonies were held for Anne and Henry Zarrow Hall for the OU School of Social Work.

2011 Dedication ceremonies were held for the renovated and expanded Gould Hall, home of the College of Architecture, marking the first time that all five disciplines were housed under one roof.

The Stuart Wing of the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art opened and included a new gallery to house the acclaimed Eugene B. Adkins Collection.

The OU School of Drama was renamed the University of Oklahoma Peggy Dow Helmerich School of Drama.

OU was selected by the U.S. Department of the Interior as the site of one of only eight regional climate science centers nationwide.

The Schusterman Center Library at OU-Tulsa was dedicated.

The School of Industrial Engineering was renamed the School of Industrial and Systems Engineering.

For the first time in OU history, OU students won the Rhodes, Marshall and Mitchell scholarships in the same year.

OU journalism professor and foreign correspondent Mike Boettcher was awarded two Emmys for his coverage of the war in Afghanistan, marking the first time an active university professor also serving as a war correspondent has won an Emmy.

An OU assistant professor and colleagues announced that they had identified two white dwarf stars considered the oldest and closest known to man. According to the researcher, these stars are the closest known examples of the oldest stars in the Universe forming soon after the Big Bang.

OU launched One University, an initiative embracing digital technologies to create an even more dynamic classroom experience for its students.

OU was named the 2012 Big 12 Conference Champion for using more green power than any other school in the Big 12 Conference, according to standings released by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. OU later was recognized as one of only four organizations nationwide to be selected as a Green Power Partner of the Year by the EPA.

The first Peggy Dow Helmerich Scholarships were awarded to 46 students in the Peggy Dow Helmerich School of Drama.

The Harold Hamm International Prize for Biomedical Research in Diabetes was established.

The University of Oklahoma implemented flat-rate tuition and mandatory fees for full-time undergraduate students carrying between 12 and 21 credit hours per semester to enable them to graduate sooner.

The university announced it would begin using the Common Application, effective with the academic year beginning fall 2014, for incoming freshmen.

The University of Oklahoma became the first public university in the nation to be awarded the prestigious Davis Cup in recognition of its record-setting enrollment of United World College international freshmen.

The OU Research Campus was named the nation's top research park for 2013 by the Association of University Research Parks.

Headington Hall, a six-story, 230,000-square-foot residence hall for 380 students, including 180 student-athletes, opened in August 2013.

The Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art began offering complimentary admission to the public, due to a gift from the OU Athletics Department.

OU's History of Science Collections acquired *Tractatus de sphaera*, a manuscript written by Oratio Grassi, a leading astronomer in Rome at the height of Galileo's astronomical discoveries.

- A first-ever grant from the GRAMMY Foundation to OU's American Organ Institute Archive and Library allowed for the preservation and public access to a unique organ recording collection. The collection consists of 760 original and irreplaceable master organ player rolls produced by the Möller Pipe Organ Company in the early 1920s.
- 2014 OU was the only Big 12 university selected as having one of America's 25 most beautiful campuses.

The Radar Innovations Laboratory was dedicated in a public ceremony.

The Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History was awarded the 2014 National Medal for Museum and Library Service.

The first ever anaerobic structural biology program in the United States was created. The OU-Einstein Research Consortium's focus would be on advancing groundbreaking research with biomedical relevance in an unexplored area and would establish an Institute of Structural Biology in the Stephenson Life Sciences Research Center on OU's Research Campus.

The lower level of the Neustadt Wing of Bizzell Memorial Library was renovated to create the Peggy V. Helmerich Collaborative Learning Center.

OU was selected to serve as Secretariat for the U.S. Department of State's Diplomacy Lab program. As Secretariat, OU would serve as the coordinator for all universities selected to participate in the nationwide program.

The University of Oklahoma achieved an 80 percent graduation rate overall for student-athletes, the highest mark ever recorded by the Sooners since the NCAA began tracking this data.

OU became the first public university in U.S. history to be ranked No. 1 in freshman National Merit Scholars enrolled.

The College of Nursing was named in honor of OU alumni Fran and Earl Ziegler of Dallas, Texas.

OU-Tulsa opened the Tandy Education Center, a \$6.4 million, state-of the art simulation and education facility.

OU's Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art exhibited a collection of 20 sculpted busts from the world's oldest museum, the Capitoline in Rome. It was the first time that collection had ever been exhibited in the United States.

The Elsie C. Brackett Theatre, a renovated theater in the Rupel J. Jones Fine Arts Center that was originally completed in 1965, opened in October.

OU dedicated the newly renovated Hester Hall, home of the OU College of International Studies, in a public ceremony in April.

- OU is the only public university in U.S. history to ever rank first among both public and private universities in the number of freshman National Merit Scholars.
  - OU has the academically highest ranked student body at a public university in Oklahoma history.
  - OU achieved an all-time record freshman-to-sophomore retention rate of 90 percent, ranking OU among the top universities in the nation.
  - OU is the only public university in Oklahoma to be included in the Fiske Guide to Colleges, which lists the top 10 percent of all U.S. universities.
  - OU has produced 29 Rhodes Scholars; no other university in Oklahoma has had more than three.
  - OU is the only university in the nation, public or private, whose students have won Goldwater, Mitchell, Truman, Rhodes, Marshall, Fulbright and National Security Education Program scholarships in the same year.

2016 Hester Hall, home of the College of International Studies, was renamed as Farzaneh Hall and the Iranian Studies Program was renamed as Farzaneh Family Center for Iranian and Persian Gulf Studies.

For the first time in the history of OU College of Medicine in Tulsa, all four years of medical school were offered at the Schusterman Center through the OU-TU School of Community Medicine.

2017 In January, David Boren began his 50th year of public service, as governor of Oklahoma, U.S. Senator, member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, and as OU president. In September, Boren announced plans to retire as president, effective June 30, 2018.

For the second year in a row, OU set an all-time record in freshman-to-sophomore retention. Of first-year students entering OU in Fall 2016, 92.1 percent returned for their sophomore year in fall 2018.

OU was ranked among the top institutions in the nation, both public and private, for its online degree programs, according to U.S. News & World Report.

For the second year in a row, OU was a recipient of the 2017 Higher Education Excellence in Diversity Award, the only national award honoring individual colleges or universities for their outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion across their campuses

OU's first Residential Colleges, Dunham College and Headington College, were dedicated. Patterned after those at Harvard, Yale, Oxford and Cambridge, OU was the first university in the state and one of the first public universities in the nation to adopt the residential college model.

Bizzell Memorial Library, built in 1929, was named among 18 stunning university libraries around the world, according to Architectural Digest. OU was the only Big 12 University to be recognized.

The Graduate School of Business at the Michael F. Price College of Business was named in honor of H.E. "Gene" Rainbolt.

The OU-Tulsa Office of Community Engagement was established.

The A. Max Weitzenhoffer School of Musical Theatre was recognized as one of the top musical theatre programs in the country by American Theatre magazine. OU was the only school in Oklahoma and the only school in the Big 12 to be selected.

The Sam Noble Museum received the prestigious 2017 University Museums and Collections Award from the International Council of Museums, which was presented in Helsinki, Finland. The museum program recognized for the award is the Oklahoma Native American Youth Language Fair, a program that for 15 years has reached thousands of young Native Americans across Oklahoma and the Southwest.

The University of Oklahoma was 2017's Big 12 Conference Champion of the College and University Green Power Challenge for using more green power than any other school in the conference, according to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency rankings.

The College of Liberal Studies was renamed the College of Professional and Continuing Studies.

James L. "Jim" Gallogly was named the 14th president of the University of Oklahoma on March 26 and assumed the office on July 1. A 1977 alumnus of the OU College of Law, Gallogly was the first-ever CEO from a Fortune 500 company to lead the University.

OU was awarded the Davis Cup for the sixth consecutive year in recognition of its enrollment of United World College international freshmen.

The OU College of Public Health was officially named the Hudson College of Public Health.

The Stephenson Cancer Center received from the National Cancer Institute the highly-competitive status of "NCI Designation," one of only 69 (top 2%) other cancer centers in the nation to be selected as a Designated Cancer Center by the NCI and the only one in the state of Oklahoma.

The university dedicated the Dodge Physics Complex and Lin Hall, a new academic building featuring more than 18,000 square feet of research laboratory space and an astronomy observatory on the roof.

The University of Oklahoma dedicated the Tom Love Innovation Hub.

Holmberg Hall celebrated its 100th anniversary.

A year-long celebration of the centennial of the Army Reserve Officers' Training Corp at OU culminated at the OU vs. Army football game.

OU celebrated the Geostationary Carbon Cycle Observatory project, known as GeoCarb, a science mission to space led by OU and funded by NASA. The mission marked one of the most exceptional accomplishments in OU history.

OU dedicated the James P. Pappas University Outreach Administration Building.

2019 The OU Board of Regents named Joseph Harroz Jr., at the time serving as dean of OU College of Law, as interim president.

OU's Class of 2023 was the largest class in the history of the University of Oklahoma. It also was one of OU's most diverse, with more than a third of the students identifying as minorities. Nearly a quarter of the freshman students were first-generation college students.

The university dedicated the OU Center for Quantum Research and Technology, placing OU and Oklahoma on track to become a leader in quantum technologies.

The Gallogly College of Engineering dedicated the new home of the Stephenson School of Biomedical Engineering.





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

## Total Recipients and Dollar Amounts









#### Percent Tenured Faculty








