Over the past decade, the Price College of Business has seen record growth in enrollments and the size of our graduating classes. And this year is no different. With that growth means more students than ever are applying for graduation and intending to walk in our upcoming December Convocation.

While we had hoped to use the Lloyd Noble Center to accommodate our record graduating class and their guests, we were unable to do so because of scheduling conflicts with OU basketball. Instead, December Convocation will take place in the McCasland Field House. Based on the recommendation of our University Events team, we have made the decision to split our upcoming December Convocation into two ceremonies.

Splitting convocation into two ceremonies will allow graduates to invite all the friends and family they like to celebrate their graduation. Holding a single ceremony would have forced us to restrict the number of attendees, which we wanted to avoid.

Both ceremonies will take place on Saturday, December 17 at McCasland Field House.

The first ceremony will begin at 5 p.m. and include the following graduates:

Bachelor's degrees: Management, International Business, Energy Management, Sports Business, Entrepreneurship, Marketing, Supply Chain Management, Healthcare Business, Economics, MIS. Master's: degrees: MIS MIT.

The second ceremony will begin at 8 p.m. and include the following graduates:

Accounting (Bachelors & Masters), Finance (Bachelors & Masters), MBA, Executive MBA (Energy and Aerospace & Defense) and PhD.

Double majors who have degrees represented in different ceremonies may choose which ceremony they would like to attend.

More details on Convocation will come over the next couple of months leading to the event.
