

SAFETY UPDATES



This Year In Review

It has been just about one year since I started tracking safety concerns for Facilities Management. Safety concerns include official Safety Observations and Near Misses, as well other "Hey, would you check this out?" concerns brought to my attention by team members. Through August 2023 we have had the following reported:

You may notice that the number closed does not match the number reported. The open ones are still in the process of being corrected.

While many of the reported concerns were low risk and easily corrected by the submitter or by various FM teams, some of the concerns could have resulted in serious injuries if they had not been reported and corrected.

While many of the reported concerns were low risk and easily corrected by the submitter or by various FM teams, some of the concerns could have resulted in serious injuries if they had not been reported and corrected.

For example, a near miss was reported when an old pipe threader was difficult to turn off with one hand. A team member's glove caught in the threader and they had difficulty turning the threader off. The threader was decommissioned and new one purchased that allows the user to easily stop the thread cutter.



Another example is damaged stairs at one of the buildings. The concrete on the stairs was deteriorating and had the potential to fail under a person's weight. The stairs are currently roped off and repairs are scheduled.



Reporting of safety concerns is greatly appreciated. I commend all of you that reported them to me over the past year. It takes everyone's diligence to identify previously unidentified risks and I thank you.

We have nearly 800 eyeballs in Facilities Management and we need every single one of them on the lookout for safety challenges. Please let me know if you see any.
